Fifth Sunday of LENT

As we approach Holy Week, our readings speak of a God who, in the midst of death, brings new life to the people. In Ezekiel, we hear that God will open the graves of the people of Israel who faced near extinction. In the Gospel of John, Jesus gives new life to Lazarus in a manner that prefigures the resurrection of Jesus. Paul tells the Romans that in Christ, God will not only give life to our bodies after death, but God offers us abundant life here and now. We observe that the external conditions for the people described in these readings did not radically change. Israel was still in exile. Lazarus would eventually face death again. But now God's presence and power are revealed. Even when our situation in life is difficult and perhaps not likely to change soon, we remember that the Spirit dwells within us.

From the Pastor's Desk

Dear St. Mary's Parishioners,

Greetings of peace and blessings to you! I hope all of you are staying safe and healthy.

It has been more than a week now since the Diocese of Greensburg temporarily suspended the public mass. I am now celebrating mass in private because of the COVID-19 pandemic outbreak. I must tell you that it was a hard decision and it affects me, especially when I celebrate the mass just by myself. Never did I expect that I would be doing this in my priestly ministry. Since I was ordained, I have become accustomed to celebrating mass with people. But now, because of this COVID-19, I need to abide with the strict guidelines. It is very emotional, especially this past weekend, when you are used to seeing the children getting excited to come in front of the altar for the children's liturgy at 8:30 A.M. on Sunday; when you are used to seeing the smiles on the faces of those coming to mass; when they shake your hand after mass and chat with you a little bit. I miss all of these. I miss celebrating the Eucharist with you.

Another concern I have is that, because we do not have public mass on weekends, our Sunday offertory is also affected. As you can imagine, our parish will continue to face regularly occurring expenses including utilities and salaries of our parish staff.

Please continue to support our parish and those who are in need. As Mother Angelica, the foundress of EWTN once said, ***"Please put us between your gas and electric bill"***. Be assured of my continued prayers for you and your loved ones, especially at this difficult time. Let me know if I can also be of help to you. I still believe that God is with us. He will restore us, just as He restored the people of Israel in the first reading (Ezekiel 37:12-14) and gave hope to Martha and Mary in the gospel when their brother, Lazarus, died. (Fifth Sunday of Lent)

Jesus said to Martha, "Your brother will rise." Martha said to him, "I know he will rise, in the resurrection on the last day." Then Jesus said these words, "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die." And then he says to her, "Do you believe this?" And she says, "Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world." (John 11:1-45)

Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in me will live, even though they die; and whoever lives by believing in me will never die. Do you believe this?"

What is a Spiritual Communion?

This is a long-standing practice of our Catholic faith.

St. Teresa of Jesus wrote: "When you do not receive Communion and you do not attend Mass, you can make a spiritual communion, which is a most beneficial practice; by it the love of God will be greatly impressed on you." [*The Way of Perfection*, Ch. 35.]

A spiritual communion can be offered by anyone who desires a deeper union with Christ and is unable to attend Mass and receive the Eucharist. There are many reasons why one may not be able to receive holy Communion. It may be due to the fact that one is not Catholic; those who have been away from the Church for a long time and have not yet made a good confession; those who are living in a state of serious sin; and also for those who are sick or homebound. This form of prayer is most appropriate in the current situation when members of the faithful are unable to attend Mass.

What must I do to make a Spiritual Communion?

The key in making a spiritual communion is to express to the Lord our faith in His merciful love and his real presence in the Eucharist. Remember, you are making a spiritual communion because you are unable to receive the Eucharist at Mass. The following prayer service can be used to make a spiritual communion. Here are four easy steps to guide you:

1. Make an act of faith – Express to Jesus your faith in His real presence in the Eucharist.
2. Make an act of love – Offer a prayer of love and gratitude to the Lord.
3. Express your desire to receive Him – Because you are not able to physically receive Jesus, express to Him your desire to receive Him in your heart.
4. Invite Jesus to come into your heart – Ask Jesus to come to you as He would if we were able to receive the sacrament of holy Communion.

The following prayer service can be used to make a spiritual communion.

HOME PRAYER SERVICE



Where possible, light a candle to symbolize Christ, the light that has conquered the darkness.

Introductory Rite

Leader: The Lord is always attentive to the needs of His people and makes all things new through the glory of the resurrection. Let us praise him! Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit. As it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever.

All: Amen.

Opening Prayer

Leader: Let us pray.

God of light, by whose Spirit all things are made new, we praise you for the gift of life, for the blessing of a new day, for your mercy that makes each day a fresh start and offers hope in time of darkness.

All: Grant us the strength to walk in your light, the grace to experience your presence with us, and the hope that comes from being made new in Christ. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Scripture: Revelation 21:3-5, 6b-7

Reader: I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Behold, God's dwelling is with the human race. He will dwell with them and they will be his people and God himself will always be with them as their God."

He will wipe every tear from their eyes, and there shall be no more death or mourning, wailing or pain, for the old order has passed away."

The one who sat on the throne said, "Behold, I make all things new." I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. To the thirsty I will give a gift from the spring of life-giving water.

The victor will inherit these gifts, and I shall be his God, and he will be my son.

Reflection

Reader: God promised to make all things new again. It's a constant promise made by God, from the lips of Isaiah to the triumphant cry of Christ risen from the dead: "Behold, I make all things new." The ability to make things new again, even better than the original creation, is a prerogative of God. God Himself is ever new — He never ages for He is eternal. Moreover, because He is infinite, we will never cease seeing new insights of his beauty and magnificence; for all eternity we will never be bored.

When we say that God is immutable, unchanging, this is not to say that He lacks life, but rather, that He is so alive that He does not lose any of his perfection, but is always new. So too with the Church, and with each one of us, her members...We have God's divine life within us. We walk in newness of life...destined to sing a new song of praise to God forevermore.

Conclusion

Leader: O Mary, you always shine on our path as a sign of salvation and of hope. We entrust ourselves to you, Health of the Sick, who at the cross took part in Jesus' pain, keeping your faith firm.

You, Salvation of Your People, know what we need, and we are sure you will provide so that, as in Cana of Galilee, we may return to joy and to feasting after this time of trial.

Help us, Mother of Divine Love, to conform to the will of the Father and to do as we are told by Jesus, who has taken upon himself our sufferings and carried our sorrows to lead us, through the cross, to the joy of the resurrection. Amen.

Under your protection, we seek refuge, Holy Mother of God. Do not disdain the entreaties of we who are in trial, but deliver us from every danger, O glorious and blessed Virgin. Amen.

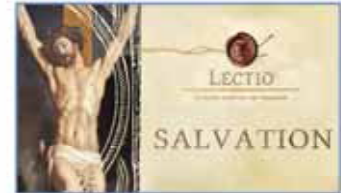

Lectio: Salvation with Dr. Michael Barber

Lenten Tombs—On this 5th Sunday in Lent, we hear the wonderful story of Lazarus and his rising from the dead to life again. Just as Lazarus was buried in his earthly tomb for a time, we also become entombed into our own sinful tendencies from which Christ so wants to free us. Our Lord wants to impart upon us three very important lessons through this miracle. **First**, we become aware of the *depth of Christ's love* for the sinner dead to sin. Just as He wept at the tomb of Lazarus, He weeps for us when we sin and choose not to repent and seek His merciful love and forgiveness. Jesus was willing to go back to an area filled with his adversaries plotting to kill him in order to personally free Lazarus. He is willing to die for us as He did for His friend. "Greater love has no man than this that a man lay down his life for his friends." John 15:13 **Second**, we see the ultimate *power over death* that Christ holds. But we need to focus more on the death of the soul rather than the body. Lazarus is raised from the dead to only die physically again someday. In the first reading from Ezekiel, we hear that God wants to "open our graves" so that our bones, dry from sin, will rise again and be filled with His spirit "so that you may live". Ezekiel 37:12-14 **Third**, we are shown that the resurrection of Lazarus is more than just His body alive again. When we allow the Lord to free us from our sins, especially thru the sacrament of Confession, we become once again "*alive in Christ Jesus*" as St. Paul reminds us. When we accept the freedom from the entombment of sin, then we will truly live because we are once again close to Jesus as He so wants us to be. "I am the resurrection and the Life" He tells us because we don't need to physically die to enjoy the rewards of His rising and ours. This Lenten season of 2020 is one that we will never forget for so many reasons. But these weeks of entombment in our homes should not look upon as wasted. These moments are for us to reflect upon because it is an act of self-sacrifice to distance ourselves from others. I am loving my neighbor, those most vulnerable to sickness, by controlling my desire to be out and about. It is no longer about my wants and needs, but of another. Each time we cleanse our hands, we can lift up our soul in prayer for ourselves and each other, so that when we emerge from our caves in a few weeks, we will look upon those faces whom I laid down my life for. †
