

# From the Pastor's Desk

We have just reopened our church for the public celebration of the mass and we are grateful for this development despite the COVID 19 that we continue to deal with.

You and I are happy being back in church to celebrate the mass, receive the Eucharist and have fellowship with one another. However, there are some guidelines that we need to observe. We discussed the matter through a video that we created and posted on our St. Mary Mother of God Facebook page, but if you are not on Facebook, you may not be aware of these guidelines and so I will review them again for your guidance.

First, when you come into church whether it is for private prayer, daily mass or weekend mass, you need to wear a mask the entire time you are inside the church. For the mass, you will be assisted by greeters and seaters who will escort you to the pew marked for seating. Because of social distancing, you will be seated six feet apart. If you are a couple or a family of three or four, you will be seated together. Not all pews will be occupied for the purpose of social distancing. Per diocesan guidelines, we can only accommodate 25% of our seating capacity which is close to eighty people. In the event of having more than eighty people, the overflow will be accommodated in the Fellowship Hall and mass will be viewed via livestream on Saturday at 4:00 P.M. and Sunday at 8:30 A.M. An Extra Ordinary Minister of Holy Communion will come to the hall during communion time to distribute Holy Communion.

Second, as you enter, there will be sanitizers that you can use to sanitize your hands and wipes to wipe the top of the pew. But we assure you that after every mass, the church is sanitized and cleaned by volunteers in order to prepare for the following mass. Towards the end of the day, all high touched areas are cleaned thoroughly with soap and water.

Third, there will be no missalettes or hymnals in the pews nor any devotional materials at the vestibule. Instead, every weekend a worship aid will be provided that you can take home with you following the mass or dispose of in the garbage can.

Fourth, during communion, everybody is encouraged to exit from their pew and proceed to the center aisle in single file. There are demarcation lines to facilitate social distancing. If you are going to receive communion, simply extend your hand close to the minister without removing your mask yet and move either to the left or right where you will see a square block and there you may consume the body of Christ reverently. Then you may return to your pew. If you are not receiving Holy Communion, you can just cross over your arms on your shoulders and I will give you a blessing. We strongly encourage you to receive the Body of Christ in the hand.

I hope this information helps you and relieves you of any worries regarding your safety while you are in church and attending mass and receiving Jesus in the Eucharist. As we celebrate the solemnity of the Holy Trinity, I invoke the Father, Son and Holy Spirit to bless you and your family as well.



#### SAINT BERNADETTE SOUBIROUS (1844-1879) - April 16th



With Immaculate Mary's "Ave Maria" for its refrain, Andy Williams' "Village of Saint Bernadette" peaked at #7 on *Billboard's Top 40* at Christmas 1959, airing on radio stations all over America. Imagine! April 16th marks the feast of Bernardette Soubirous, the teenager who, combing a refuse heap for firewood, saw a "beautiful lady" who identified herself in words Bernadette faithfully reported to the bishop, though she did not understand their

meaning: "I am the Immaculate Conception". Relentlessly interrogated, she never wavered in her story or sweetness. Chronically ill all her life and dead at thirty-five, Bernadette left behind the shrine at Lourdes where healing waters still flow from the spring that her "beautiful lady" pointed out to her. †

## Parish Information/Events

The Administrative Office continues to be open the normal hours of Monday through Friday, 9:00 A.M. to 3:00 P.M. Effective June 1st, our weekday and weekend mass schedule resumed (with guidelines). St. Mary's will continue to be open for private prayer from 9:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M. daily and 12:00 Noon to 5:00 P.M. on Sundays. Below are the guidelines that are to be followed when visiting our church and what is being done for your safety.

- Wear a mask upon entrance to the church.
- Social distancing must be observed six feet apart from the next person.
- Only designated pews are to be used for mass/private prayer. For morning and weekend masses, the main doors of the church will be the only way to enter. Greeters and seaters will be at the entrance to greet and seat you. The collection basket will be in the back of the church. When receiving communion, please abide by the markings. This will be explained prior to the beginning of each mass. For private prayer, you are to enter at the side entrance.
- There are sanitizers and wipes that are to be used as you enter the church.
- The identified pews and other high contact areas like doorknobs, handles and tables will be sanitized and disinfected twice a day.
- Weekly, each church's high contact areas will be cleaned with soap and water and then sanitized.
- Hymnals and missalettes have been taken out from the pews for your safety.

Christian or Disciple? - The word Christian appears in the New Testament only three times. It was used especially by those who were not Christians holding a negative connotation. "If you suffer as a Christian, do not be ashamed, but praise God that you bear that name." (1 Peter 4:16). To say I am a Christian is to agree who Jesus is and to accept the basic beliefs of Christianity as if checking off a list. So, who is a disciple then? The term disciple appears in the New Testament in well over two hundred and fifty instances. It comes from the Latin word discipulus which means "pupil" or "learner". A disciple is one who seeks to identify with the master teacher and follow His teachings fully. There were many teachers at the time of Christ, even John the Baptist had his own set of disciples whom we hear about (John 1:35-37). Jesus' teachings, however, were unprecedented. At first, His students did not come to Him, but were called personally to a life of discipleship, a call that they had to answer and commit to (Mark 1:16-20). It was a calling to a new way of life, a radical path to walk WITH God instead of just TOWARDS God. Jesus Himself describes who a disciple is in Matthew 16:24, "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me." So, to be willing to be called a disciple, we must be willing to leave behind those things which keep us from Jesus. We cannot be afraid of suffering and persecution, even from those who may be the dearest and closest to us. Finally, we need to walk in the footsteps of Christ and be so close as to allow the dust He kicks up to cover and overwhelm us in our journey. To be a Christian is a choice and anyone can make this claim. But to be a disciple is a commitment that involves risks, but great rewards. Many are called, but few are chosen. (Matthew 22:14). †
