## FOOD FROM HEAVEN

God sustained the people of Israel for forty years in the desert with manna sent down from heaven, and Moses doesn't want them to forget it. God brought forth water from stone for them to drink, and Moses doesn't want them to forget this, either. And Moses tells them—twice—that the food that God sent was a food that neither they nor their ancestors before them had ever experienced before.

Jesus, too, speaks of food coming down from heaven, food that the Jewish people had never experienced before. Recalling the manna in the desert, Jesus doesn't want them to forget it either, explaining that he is the food and drink of eternal life. And Paul reiterates to the Corinthians and to all of us that in the bread and in the cup, we share in the body and blood of Christ.

## *From the Pastor's Desk*

I am happy to share with you that finally two of our candidates in the RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults) Program, **Bonnie Eshenbaugh** and **Laura Welsh**, will be welcomed this Sunday at the 11:00 A.M. mass after receiving the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist. They were supposed to be receiving the said sacraments last Easter Vigil but because of the COVID-19, it was postponed.

But how fitting for them to receive the Eucharist this Sunday because we are celebrating the *Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ*. *The Body and Blood of Christ* is what we are receiving in the mass during communion.

The Eucharist was instituted by Christ at the Last Supper with His disciples and had been perpetuated in memorial by His disciples to the early Christians and until now. However, the observance of it as a solemn feast only began in the 12<sup>th</sup> century when the Church saw the rise of a desire for a more intense devotion to the Eucharist, mainly the adoration, although the aspect of sacrifice and meal was not forgotten. Juliana of Retiennes (1192-1258), a nun of the Augustinian Convent near Liege in Belgium and later prioress, revealed a series of visions granted to her, the first during 1208 in which the Lord expressed the desire for a solemn feast in honor of the Blessed Sacrament. This feast was introduced in Liege in 1246 and celebrated on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday. Pope Urban IV (1261-12-64), a confidant of Juliana, extended the feast to the Universal Church and is celebrated on the Sunday after Trinity Sunday which is what we are celebrating today.

The *Body and Blood of Christ* are so important in our Christian life because they give us nourishment into our spiritual life just as physical food gives nourishment to our physical body. Also having faith in Jesus, receiving His Body and Blood leads us to eternal life. This is what our gospel this Sunday is telling us. Jesus proclaims that He is the Living Bread and that whoever eats His flesh and drinks His Blood will have eternal life. He says: "He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up at the last day," (v. 54). He is capable of giving us eternal life.

And so therefore, the *Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ* affords us the opportunity to give God collective thanks for Christ's abiding presence with us which is made visible in the Eucharist. Let us appreciate Him with praise and thanksgiving.

# Solemnity of Corpus Christi

**SAINT ROMUALD (c. 951-1027) - June 19th**



"God so loved the world," declares John 3:16. "Do not love the world," warns 1 John 2:15. The "world" to love: this planet, entrusted to our stewardship, and its people, God's children all. The "world" to flee: "sensual lust, enticement for the eyes, and a pretentious life" (1 John 2:16). Born in nobility, Romuald's conversion followed the shock of witnessing his father murder an enemy. Renouncing his privileged world, Romuald sought God's world in monastic life. Its winding turns and

several dead ends make Romuald's journey resonate with all who find life more maze than superhighway. Both the hermit's solitary struggle and community life's unique challenges shaped Romuald's legacy: his vast Camaldolese Benedictine family of monks, nuns, and lay associates who, these thousand years later, from the mountain solitude of Camaldoli, Italy to an urban monastery in Berkeley, California—in Asia, Africa, South America, Europe—integrate Romuald's experience into their witness of solitary prayer, communal charity and worship, and promotion of contemplative spirituality in this world that can so easily distract us from the God who loves it still. †

## Parish Information/Events

**The Administrative Office** continues to be open the normal hours of Monday through Friday, 9:00 A.M. to 3:00 P.M. Our normal weekday and weekend mass schedule has resumed (with guidelines). In addition, St. Mary's will continue to be open for private prayer from 9:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M. daily and 12:00 Noon to 5:00 P.M. on Sundays. Below are the guidelines that are to be followed when visiting our church and what is being done for your safety.

- Wear a mask upon entrance to the church.
- Social distancing must be observed - six feet apart from the next person.
- Only designated pews are to be used for mass/private prayer. For morning and weekend masses, the main doors of the church will be the only way to enter. Greeters and seaters will be at the entrance to greet and seat you. The collection basket will be in the back of the church. When receiving communion, please abide by the markings. This is explained prior to the beginning of each mass. For private prayer, you are to enter at the side entrance.
- There are sanitizers and wipes that are to be used as you enter the church.
- The identified pews and other high contact areas like doorknobs, handles and tables will be sanitized and disinfected twice a day.
- Weekly, each church's high contact areas will be cleaned with soap and water and then sanitized.
- Hymnals and missalettes have been taken out from the pews for your safety.

**Onion Skin or Touchscreen...** Last week we discovered that being a disciple of Christ involves a commitment more than just a choice. The life of discipleship is a lifelong journey of many "yesses" to God and fine tuning our relationship with Him so that our lives may be abundantly filled with joy (John 10:10). There are five areas in which the Lord wants us to incorporate into our everyday lives. Let us think upon each one of these over the next few weeks so that our summer "break" will not include a break with God. Saint John tells us that "in the beginning was the Word...and the Word was God" (John 1:1). The entire Old Testament is an accounting of the words of God spoken to us which continually call us back into a loving communion with him. God used the Holy Spirit to work through human hands to compose forty-six books, forty-six different ways to tell us "I love you and desire that you turn from other loves in your life that will bring you a much lesser joy." Then the single greatest event in all of human history happens, "The Word became flesh and dwelt among us" (John 1:14). The Word of God, Christ Jesus, took on our human nature to not just speak of God's love, but to act it out from the cradle to the cross. A disciple immerses himself or herself in Scripture on a daily basis. This is a must! How can I continue to grow in a loving union with my beloved if I do not read His love letters to me and understand what I mean to Him? We must remember that the Word of God in scripture is "living and effective" and "able to discern the thoughts of the heart" (Hebrews 4:12). God's greatest desire is to meet us, to speak, instruct, challenge, and transform us through the repeated reading of scripture in our lives. The first area of focus in our growing as a true disciple who longs to walk in the footsteps of the loving savior is a daily commitment to take up and read these words. In a world full of dark valleys and dimmed by sin, we can take to heart what the psalmist cries out, "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path" (Psalm 119:105). Jesus told the scribe that we should "love the Lord with all our mind, heart, soul and strength" (Matthew 22:37). So let us fill our minds with these stories of love and promise so that they will sink into our hearts and souls and be made manifest in the strength of our daily commitment. Scripture reading will then become not just a joyful duty, but a blessed delight in which we will know what is noble, pure, good, and holy (Philippians 4:8). †

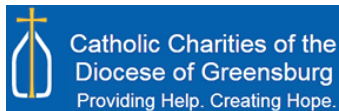
