Catholic Schools Week is here! The main goal of this annual celebration is to build community awareness about the strengths and distinctiveness of Catholic schools. Catholic Schools Week is also about strengthening relationships among all who have a stake in our schools – students, staff, families, priests, parishioners, and members of the wider community. It's a highlight of the school year when we can focus on our greater purpose of bringing alive the gospel message.
