In this issue of *Proclamation* we hope to provide you with insight into the Eucharist that will enable our entire parish community to come to a greater understanding of the amazing gift that Jesus has given us.

Eucharist means Thanksgiving. Most Blessed Sacrament Parish has much to be thankful for, including so many of you who have given of your time, talent, and treasure to make *your* parish a vibrant, spiritual community of Christ’s disciples.
