As part of the celebration of its 75th anniversary, the Cathedral of the Holy Spirit in Bismarck will have a 40 Hours Devotion on November 20, 21, and 22, a special 40-hour period of continuous prayer made before the Blessed Sacrament in solemn exposition. Of course, the focus of this devotion is on the Holy Eucharist. It gives us time to deepen our appreciation of the importance of the mystery of the Eucharist in our lives. The event includes Eucharistic Adoration in the main church, Masses, confessions, and Fr. Brian Gross will lead a parish mission with a series of homilies on the Eucharist. All are welcome to attend as much of the 40 Hours as their schedule permits. Adoration during this event is open to everyone in the Diocese of Bismarck. This is a great time to give thanks for all of our blessings and to prepare our hearts for Advent.

Modifications to COVID-19 Restrictions

Effective the weekend of June 20-21, 2020 Bishop Kagan issued further modifications to the COVID-19 restrictions for Liturgical, Sacramental, and Parish life for all parishes in the Diocese of Bismarck:

- * Holy Communion may be received either in the hand or on the tongue but only a priest or deacon may distribute Holy Communion. Hand sanitizer will be readily available to those distributing Holy Communion.
- * Weddings may have up to three men and women to assist and accompany the bride and groom, and other guests may attend. Social distancing should continue to be maintained and there is to be no congregating inside the church before or after the ceremony.
- * Funerals may now have a vigil service or visitation in the funeral home either the day before or the day of the funeral. There is to be NO visitation in the Church. Other guests may attend the funeral while maintaining social distancing. There is to be no funeral luncheon held at the church after a funeral Mass.
- * Parish meetings may resume at the pastor's discretion, but social distancing is to be maintained in all meetings.

The following restrictions remain in place at our Tri-Parish :

- * There will be no Mass servers or lay Eucharistic ministers assisting at Mass until further notice.
- * Holy Communion will continue to be distributed only under the sacred species of the consecrated host.
- * The exchange of the Sign of Peace is still suspended.
- * Confessions are to be heard only behind a screen.
- * Collection baskets will not be passed from pew to pew, but will continue to be available at the entrances of the church before or after Mass. The dispensation from the Sunday obligation to attend Mass remains in effect.

Please remember these general guidelines while attending Mass:

If you or anyone in your household is sick in any way or is at a higher risk of contracting COVID-19, we respectfully ask you to please stay at home until you or that person is able to safely return to Mass. Please avoid congregating in any area of the church or gathering space before or after Mass.

Please use hand sanitizer upon entering the church. Households are asked to maintain a social distance of six feet from other households at all times. –

While in the pews, gathering space, or other areas of the church. – While in line for Holy Communion or Confession.
