My Dear Parish Family:

This Sunday, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. Today's readings reflect the *mystery* (in a religious sense) of a reality beyond anything we can experience or understand in this world. The heart of the mystery of the Holy Trinity is that "God Himself is an eternal exchange of love, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and He has destined us to share in that exchange." (CCC 221).

In the first reading from Exodus, we witness a frustrated Moses seeking to renew a covenant that he broke with God due to the sins of the Israelites. God came to Moses, identified Himself as *Lord* (in Hebrew means *Yahweh*) and discloses all that He is: a God of compassion to those who are not deserving of His fidelity and kindness; He is a faithful and loving God, *a loving Father, Son, and Holy Spirit*.

In his second letter to the Corinthians, Saint Paul tells them that they must change their ways, their sinful actions. He stresses unity, to encourage one another, to live in peace and rejoice. Saint Paul, in all his wisdom, concludes with a blessing: "*The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with all of you.*"

In the Gospel of John, Jesus is speaking to Nicodemus, a Pharisee who came to Him in the dark of the night. Jesus reveals to him everything that you and I have lived since the beginning of Lent, Triduum, Easter Season, and the special Holy Days that follow. Jesus came to show God's love in this world; whoever believes in Him will not be condemned.

It seems that in each of these readings it was imperative that the recipients of God's eternal love had to build a relationship – an *intimate* relationship with Him. Then, they had to build community, a communion with one another. Their hardships, even sinfulness, ironically brought them closer to God so they could recognize, believe and trust in the Triune God.

The Triune God, who touched Moses and the people of Corinth, has changed the lives of many this past Easter Vigil. On Pentecost Sunday, just one week ago, our Neophyte, who entered into full communion with the Catholic Church, gave a brief, but powerful witness of her faith journey. With a sincere and open heart, she described her life void of God and the hardships she endured. It wasn't until she came to *know, believe, and trust* in the Triune God, that the core of her life began to change. She came to believe that she was a child of God – His daughter – now and forever.

"*By the grace of Baptism 'in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit'*" (CCC 265) we are called to share in His eternal love. Saint Paul so beautifully describes this grace in his letter to the Galatians 4: 4 – 6:

"When the fullness of time had come, God sent his Son, born of a woman...to ransom (us)... so that we might receive adoption. As proof that you are children, God sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying out, 'Abba, Father!'"

As we cross ourselves in prayer, **In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit**, may we never take this action or these words for granted. May we cherish the gifts of mercy, grace, kindness and fidelity that He so freely gives to you and to me as we continue our earthly journey in His Name.
