Reflection on Today's Readings

Today's Scripture readings parallel a recurring theme in the book we are reading and discussing on First Saturdays at Holy Rosary, *Mother Teresa of Calcutta: A Personal Portrait*. Now canonized, the saintly Mother Teresa exemplified how to abandon one's attachments and earthly possessions and accept the will of God instead. She focuses her attention exclusively on Jesus and particularly the presence of Christ manifested in the multitude of poor and dying in Calcutta, India. In all interactions she encouraged that attention be shifted away from her and directed toward Christ.

Today's Gospel speaks of a wealthy young man who is faithful in living out the commandments, but when speaking directly with Jesus reveals he is unwilling to abandon his possessions to gain eternal life. In response to this message, we may examine if we seek and cling to material comforts with more energy than we devote to the efficacious Word of God, solely trusting in His providential care.

The first reading from Wisdom speaks of preferring prudence and wisdom—of which riches are “nothing in comparison with her.” (Wis 7:8) We are called to remember that scepter and throne, health and beauty are all passing things of this world, but God's wisdom is the source of “all good things” that endure.

There are countless delightful examples in *Mother Teresa of Calcutta*, by Msgr. Leo Maasburg exemplifying how Mother Teresa would gratefully accept a gift presented to her — only to immediately re-gift the item to someone else in need. Often, the gift would fill a spiritual deficit instead of the basic need of food or clothing. For her, the most important part of any gift was not the actual item, but rather the spirit of love in which the gift was given.

Mother Teresa insisted that before daily work began, the religious sisters must arise early to spend time in prayer, particularly daily Mass, sharing in the Eucharist, and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. There was nothing more important. Saint Teresa of Calcutta trusted blindly in God's providence so that the fruit of her prayers were manifested in the generosity of random strangers in supporting her missionary work as willed by God.

Mother Teresa reflected that the greatest poverty is loneliness and of feeling unloved. May we be filled with God's love and, like Saint Teresa of Calcutta, bravely accept Christ's invitation in today's Gospel to “*come follow me.*” (Mark 10:21)

Communion: Communion distribution will be in the form of the Host only. The full Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ is contained in the Consecrated Host.

Sign of Peace: The sign of peace has resumed. Please offer a touchless acknowledgement of peace to others not in your family or household.

Synod 2021-2023 “For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, Mission”

Bishop Malesic will celebrate an Opening Liturgy for the Synod on Sunday, October 17 during the 10:30 am Mass at the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist. This will kick off the diocesan phase of the three-year synodal journey of consultations and discernment, culminating with the Assembly of Bishops in October 2023 in Rome.

A leadership team has been formed to plan and implement the synodal process within the diocese. Through the end of the year, all baptized Catholics will be invited to participate in this process of listening, dreaming, and discerning God's call for the Church amid the present signs of the times.

The diocesan discernment will culminate in a “Pre-Synodal Meeting” early next year.
