

## From the Heart - by Fr. Kern

Next weekend will already be the first days of November! As you recall, the 1<sup>st</sup> of November is ordinarily a holy day of obligation marking All Saints Day. However, this year because the 1<sup>st</sup> is on a Saturday, the obligation to attend mass on that day is removed. I will follow the normal weekday mass schedule with mass at 8:30am on Saturday morning at St. Teresa. It is a great feast day celebrating all those who have lived a life of faith in Jesus and now are with Him and all the holy ones for eternity in Heaven. Next Sunday, on the 2<sup>nd</sup> of November is celebrated All Souls Day where the Church prays for all the faithful departed who are awaiting entrance into Heaven in purgatory. It is the constant duty of us here on earth to pray for the souls of the deceased who are undergoing purification from their personal sins or their attachment to sin and this world as they await their welcome into Heaven. It has never been the teaching of the Church that immediately upon someone's death they are guaranteed to be in Heaven, so we pray and sacrifice for those undergoing the final test and being made ready to be perfectly united to the Perfect One. We can't dwell with God without first being made perfect—this is what purgatory accomplishes and why we so frequently offer the mass for the deceased.

Additionally next weekend for the masses, we will welcome Father Will Thompson the Vocations Director for the Diocese of Winona. Fr. Thompson is originally from Lake City, MN and currently resides at IHM Seminary in Winona where he is both on faculty at the seminary and also serving as Vocations Director. He relies heavily on pastors and the faithful alike to aide him in his role of directing vocations and so we welcome his message next weekend of promoting vocations to the priesthood.

Finally, this past Wednesday we celebrated the feast day of Saint Pope John Paul II. This is the first time since he was made a Saint last Easter season that we have celebrated his feast day. Pope John Paul II was a remarkable man who lived in Poland under both Nazi and Soviet regimes. All of his immediate family was deceased before he was 25 and his life was rather difficult. Yet out of those sufferings and trials, came a man who depended deeply on prayer and his relationship with God. We could say he was purified and grew from these life experiences. John Paul II was known for his intellectual abilities, his humor, his love for youth, and his charisma, but when I encountered JP II as a sophomore in high school at WYD in Toronto, I felt a call to greatness well-up inside of me. I experienced very powerfully and in a very real way both a call to follow Jesus and a desire to sacrifice my life for God. —————>
