

From the Heart - by Fr. Kern

This past week we had a wonderful week with Totus Tuus in our Tri-Parish. Approximately 30 youth attended the daytime session grades 1-6 and about 10 in the evening sessions for grades 7-12. The week is pretty full as the kids have a great time while learning about their faith. This year Totus Tuus taught them about the 7 virtues, along with the beatitudes, as well as the Sorrowful Mysteries of the Rosary. I really appreciate Totus Tuus as the youth really do learn about their Catholic faith as well as have the opportunity to go to daily mass and receive confession during the week. It opens their minds and hearts to a deeper experience of our Catholic faith. I would like to thank the Totus Tuus team for their hard work this week in teaching and inspiring our youth in the ways of faith. I would like to especially thank Vicki Kunkel who was present everyday and evening to help organize the flow of the days. I would also like to thank Marcie and Cliff Anderson and Jim and Gloria Langworthy for hosting the women and men this week.

The youth learned about the four Cardinal (word means hinge) virtues this week. It seems to me that in our modern day we often under-utilize the virtues. We use vague language like 'be nice' or 'be good' to refer to every situation. The Cardinal virtues are the four virtues that all other virtues come from or hinge upon. The virtue of **prudence** enables us to make the right decision in the right situation and to also put that decision into action. The virtue of **fortitude** enables us to be willing to suffer—to persevere in order to achieve some good. The virtue of **temperance** enables us to choose rightly as it regards our passions and what is truly good for us especially in the areas of food, drink, and sex. The virtue of **justice** enables us to give to another what is due to them and here we think of the respect and dignity first but then even right ordering of our relationships especially by putting God first. The virtues lived in Christianity put us on the path to heaven. They help us to overcome difficulty and allow for us to willingly move forward in every situation. We practice the virtues in the smaller situations of life so that when big things come we are able to keep going.

This Tuesday over 30 members (there is still room!) of our Tri-Parish will go on a one day pilgrimage to the Cathedral of St. Paul, the Basilica of St. Mary, and to St. Constantine Ukrainian Catholic Church and we will enter into deliberate prayer for the church of Minnesota. If you are unable to join us please unite your prayers and sacrifices on Tuesday in an offering for the purification and renewal of the Church. We will implore God's abundant grace on the leaders of the Church and upon all members that we might depend more completely on Christ and His plan for the salvation of the world that comes through the Church and for the deepening renewal of our own parishes.
