From the Heart by Fr. Jason Kern

This weekend All Saints' Day falls on Sunday. This is truly one of the most joyous feast days in the Church year. We shouldn't allow it to pass by because it falls on a Sunday! This feast day celebrates each person who is in heaven. It is a day the Church on earth cries out in jubilation that God desires to draw each of us to eternal life in Heaven. It is only by the death of Jesus that we are saved and by our cooperation with grace throughout our life that we enter into the promise of eternal life. Those who are in heaven made a full assent of their will to God. They believed all that is revealed by God through the Church and fully conformed their lives to Jesus. Upon conforming their life to Jesus, they persevered at the time of their death with confidence in God's mercy. The grace of final perseverance is a grace from God for us to be fortified in the entrustment of our souls to His infinite mercy. It is offered to each person who is in a state of grace at the moment of their death. We must pray now for the grace of final perseverance: pray to trust God now and at the hour of our death.

Death is the passageway to dwell with God. On this All Saints' Day, might we be reminded of our need to be perfect to dwell with God who is perfect. It is essential to conform our souls to God in perfect love. If we do not seek this now and die in a state of grace, we will need to be perfectly purified before we can enter heaven. This is the Church's teaching on purgatory—to be purified so that we might be perfect to dwell with Him Who is perfect.

The month of November is also known as the month of holy souls. It is a month dedicated to praying for those who have died and await that final purification and entrance into heaven. Pray for the deceased and beg God to receive them into eternal rest. It is a practice for many Catholics in the month of November to visit a cemetery. Some consider this a weird or strange practice—perhaps creepy or eerie. However, if we recognize that the spiritual realm is real and that angels, demons, and souls of deceased humans do really exist we should have a discipline of entering into this realm. A way to call this to mind is to go and walk through a cemetery and pray the rosary. It is a simple way to pray for those who have died and make a profound impact on us. My home parish in Owatonna has a long tradition of meeting at the cemetery once a year and praying a rosary procession praying for the dead. Cemeteries are blessed grounds—they are holy places for us to be reminded of our own mortality and God's desire to bring our souls to heaven.

Monday, November 2 is All Souls Day. The Roman Catholic celebration is associated with the doctrine that the souls of the faithful who at death have not been cleansed from the temporal punishment due to venial sins and from attachment to mortal sins cannot immediately attain the beatific vision in heaven, and that they may be helped to do so by prayer and by the sacrifice of the Mass. In other words, when they died, they had not yet attained full sanctification and moral perfection, a requirement for entrance into Heaven. This sanctification is carried out posthumously in Purgatory.

The entire month of November is dedicated to praying for the souls in Purgatory. To this end, there are some cards and pamphlets available at each church to aid us in this month of praying for the faithful departed. These are beautiful devotions to pray for our own loved ones and for all those who have no one to pray for them. And remember—once they get to heaven, they will be praying for you!
