From the Heart by Fr. Jason Kern

Jesus Christ always knows the way forward even when it seems like an impossible situation. In this weekend's Gospel, the religious authorities bring forward a woman caught in the act of adultery. They certainly have their idea about how this scenario should go and it isn't hard for us to imagine the mob mentality surrounding this scenario and how quickly this could have turned violent. Jesus is patient in the situation and his quiet patience invites reflection and calms the angst. His response is calculated and not reactive. He models for us how to handle conflict. Jesus responds gently and keeps the bigger picture in mind throughout this situation. Jesus is focused on the shaping of the whole culture and not on the quickest solution of bringing this woman down because of her choice. "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." This story of Jesus not only shows us the depths of His mercy and desire to restore us to right relationship with God and others but it also demonstrates how much we can trust Jesus in difficult times. When our lives feel out of sorts or we don't know where to turn for answers, bringing our lives to Jesus is always the right decision. However, we have to be willing to accept His plan, to accept His purpose, and to move forward with what He is asking of us. Jesus' plan will be bigger than any one of us but we can trust that it will ultimately be for our good even if it doesn't make full sense to us right away. The Jews in today's gospel had to feel this way, yet they accepted Jesus' teaching and to their credit came to a deeper understanding of God's mercy.

Last week was not easy and was an emotional week leading up to and since the announcement of the changing Mass times for our Tri-Parish. I don't expect it to feel good for any of us, but I am confident in this plan as the best for the faith of the most people in our parishes. Though we might find ourselves frustrated with me and the decision, I invite you to talk to Jesus about it and tell Him how you feel. Ask Him to show you His plan in it and how He might lead us forward in these days ahead. Ask Jesus to bring about a deeper unity in our Tri-Parish rather than discord over where Mass is on a given weekend or day. Though it may take time for some of us to come around, I am confident that if we work together this can be an opportunity to rely on one another more and rather than doing our own thing as a member of a Tri-Parish we can work together for the common good of bringing the faith more alive into our communities. Thank you for those who have told me they agree with the decision and offered their support. Parishioners from all three churches have spoken to me in a positive way about the new schedule—that even though it is difficult and they are not even happy with the change, they recognize it as the best decision. I also thank those who have respectfully shared their concerns or emotions about the decision—I knew this wouldn't be easy. I'm asking Jesus to give us strength to undergo change and to see how He wants us to trust Him in these days perhaps more than we ever have before.





Saturday, March 19th is the Feast of St. Joseph

According to St. Bernadine of Siena, "St. Joseph exceeds in grace and blessing of all the patriarchs, prophets, St. John the Baptist, Saints Peter and Paul, the Apostles, holy martyrs, and doctors of the Church. Following Our Blessed Mother, St. Joseph is the greatest saint in heaven." Pope

John Paul II wrote an encyclical letter about St. Joseph, calling him The Guardian of the Redeemer, "into whose custody God entrusted his most precious treasure." St. Joseph is the patron saint of many things, including: the Universal Church, husbands, fathers, families, workers, seminarians, virgins, and a happy death.
