From the Heart by Fr. Jason Kern

I would like to say a special thank you this week to all the catechists and our faith formation coordinators for their hard work this year to assist

our young people to grow in faith. The dedication shown to teaching the faith makes a huge difference in the faith being handed on in our communities. I am sincerely grateful for the willingness to support and encourage our youth to grow in their faith that I see in our parishes. While much good work is being done, I have decided to organize a faith formation committee for our Tri-Parish to evaluate, vision, and plan how we can strengthen our faith formation programs in the Tri-Parish. It has been a desire of mine to consider how to best teach the youth the faith of Jesus Christ and His Church even before I was ordained a priest. I have become convinced that our current style of an hour a week of sitting in classrooms is leading more people to being bored with the faith than it is into a personal relationship with Jesus and His Church that transforms them to live their faith in the modern world

The goal of the faith formation committee will be to evaluate our current practices and logistics regarding curriculum, catechist training/formation, and overall vision of what a solid faith formation program will consist of. I am not setting out with any goal of combining or restructuring our program but we do need to be able to freely put everything on the table in order to plan effectively the best plan for faith formation in our Tri-Parish. It is obvious to me that I can't plan and implement further growth alone and so this committee will help me to do just that. The committee will be made up of parishioners from all three parishes and will work together to find the best way forward. It is my sole desire that the faith of Jesus Christ and His Church be taught and handed on as effectively as possible in our communities. Thanks for your prayers for this visioning process.

This week will begin a rather wild summer schedule for me. On Sunday morning, May 8th, I will be leaving early with a group of 27 students from the Newman Center on pilgrimage to Rome, Assisi, & Florence, Italy. I will return sometime in the middle of the night on May 18th. I am very excited for this opportunity and will keep you in my prayers during the trip. Please email me if you have any prayer intentions you would like me to take with me on the trip in a specific way. Fr. Andy Olsem will be with us next Sunday and the following weekend.
