

This week we welcome the Totus Tuus Team. Totus Tuus is a Latin phrase meaning 'Totally Yours' which was the motto of Saint Pope John Paul II as he dedicated his life and papacy totally to Jesus through Mary. This is a phrase I have often prayed with as I live my own consecration to Jesus through Mary. The team consists of four members: two men and two women. This year the team is: Adam Worm (Adam is a seminarian for the Diocese of Winona and attended MSU, Mankato), Brian Klein, Maggie Ogram, and Toni Schlangen. Please keep them in your prayers this week and throughout the summer. The team is staying in parishioners homes and having meals brought to them from our parishioners so that they can host a faith formation program during the day program and a youth group setting for older students in the evening. It is always a fun week with good opportunities for the youth to learn and engage their faith. On **Wednesday, June 29th** there is a potluck supper that is hosted at St. Teresa. This is truly intended to be a whole Tri-Parish picnic and not just for those who have children attending. Please plan to come and enjoy a beautiful evening and meet the team. I love having Totus Tuus in the parishes and the week is always a great blessing for our youth. Everyone is welcome even if you can't come every day.

The following week July 3rd-9th, 17 of our youth will travel to Champaign, IL for Catholic Heart Work Camp. Fr. Vogel is also bringing some youth from their Tri-Parish this year and so we will travel down together to join our youth for the week of working on houses, visiting the needy, and assisting in many other ways. It will be a special week as we will work hard, have fun, and attend daily Mass and other prayer and Catholic faith opportunities. Please keep our youth in prayer for the many happenings over the next couple weeks and throughout summer.

While I regret to miss so much time in the parishes with you, I know the Lord has brought about these opportunities for our youth and the youth of the Diocese to pour His grace and love into our hearts.
