From the Heart by Fr. Jason Kern

This week we kick off another year of Faith Formation in our Tri-Parish. We will have a parish wide gathering called: ALIVE! I invite everyone to join us this Wednesday for an evening meal served from 5:30-6:30pm followed by a reflection and time of prayer. In a time of transition, we need to orient ourselves on Jesus and His purpose and plan. Might we set our hearts on Jesus and focus in on Him by listening to His heart as a whole tri parish. We are the people of God and we have the capacity to discern and sift through what He desires for us. Let's begin this year by first stopping to listen in and ask for the grace to be available to God and to allow God to work through us. I hope everyone might join us for an evening of community focused and centered on Jesus, the Good Shepherd. When we follow the voice of the Shepherd we are alive in His grace and power.

(Reprinted from last week) The following is a very general overview of changes and hopes for the Youth Faith Formation Program in our parishes: We have hired Jonah Lippert as our Tri-Parish Faith Formation Coordinator and Youth Minister. This provides someone to oversee, plan, facilitate, and advance our programs that have run smoothly but without the opportunity to advance them throughout the years.

We have made the difficult decision to consolidate from 3 sites to 2 for this coming year. Faith Formation will be on Wednesday nights at St. Matthew Church in Vernon Center and St. Teresa Church in Mapleton. This allows for us to strive toward making the best learning environment for our children without combining grade levels as much as possible. It also allows us to teach a more unified curriculum.

We have a plan to implement opportunities to assist our catechists with training, support, and resources to more fluidly teach the material on Wednesday evenings. Additionally we have taken our current curriculum (with the help of available resources) and broken it down into a more digestible weekly load that will assist catechists in knowing what to focus on while teaching.

We plan to launch a new curriculum by the fall of 2017 called Catechesis of the Good Shepherd. This is a Montessori style teaching method for ages 3-6 that allows the child to learn at their level with presentations that put them in the learning seat rather than just trying to listen or have the catechist keep them busy while they are there. Future age levels would be available once the youngest level is fully implemented. Check out the website <http://www.cgsusa.org/> to see more about the program and its many benefits.

Please read my newsletter column for a more full overview and also a little rationale for why it is time to move on these changes. It is never easy for us to accept change, but by working together we create an environment where we can give our kids the best. I hope you can come along for the ride and watch what the Lord can do as I trust He has been leading the Faith Formation Committee and giving us grace to implement these opportunities
