From the Heart by Fr. Jason Kern

This week we had our first classes for Youth Faith Formation in the Tri-Parish. Thanks for making the sacrifice to get your children and grandchildren to class. This remains a vital opportunity for our young people to grow in their Catholic faith and establish a deeper understanding of what it means to live in a relationship with God and His Church. I am aware of how the transitions have affected people and create a juggling act for some of you. Thank you for prioritizing your schedules around the Sunday Mass and Wednesday evening faith formation program. I hear from many of you about how busy your lives are and the life of especially our older children have become. While I caution against this, I invite the sacrifice of your time for our faith not to become one more thing but the very center of our weeks which give all of our other rushing around meaning and purpose. Without our faith, life is empty and hopeless. With our faith, life is full and vibrant because it is centered on grace, peace, joy, and the love that only God can truly give. Peace to you and special thanks yet again to our catechists for teaching our youth the Catholic faith.

This week Monday-Wednesday the priests of the Diocese of Winona will gather for our annual Presbyteral Days where all the priests gather with Bishop Quinn for a time of reflection, fraternity, and some practical planning. We don't dive too deeply into operational things, but the Bishop gives us an update and has a chance to discuss life in the Diocese. We have had some rather tough years and the hope on my part is that this time is always a renewal and opportunity to stand together with all of our brothers who serve as priests. There are so many great examples of priests who serve with very generous hearts. I am grateful to serve as a priest and each October am reminded of the gift of brotherly friendship that I have in brother priests. I have many priests who I consider friends and a few who are my closest of friends but when everyone is gathered for a time of recreation and brotherhood it is a true blessing. Thank you for understanding the need to get away even if only for a couple days to gather as brother priests.

Finally, RCIA has begun and I am excited for another year of teaching those who are seeking to discover the fullness of God's riches in their life by inquiring about the Catholic Church or become Catholic. If you know of anyone who might be interested, it doesn't hurt to toss an invite their way by simply suggesting, 'have you ever considered becoming Catholic?' You might be surprised how they respond. Or they might decline or even reject your question altogether. Trust in the Lord and He will act!

Have a great week this week. Keep your eyes on Jesus. And prayers with our farmers as they hopefully spend some time in their combines this week!


