Pre-Baptism preparation is required. Please contact the office at least one month before the desired date.


The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick Please notify the office if you or a family member is in the hospital or homebound and would like a pastoral visit.

This week Jesus continues His discussion on the Kingdom of Heaven. He compares it to a buried treasure. Sometimes I tell the kids who have a hard time getting to Mass that if we gave out a million dollars to everyone who came to Mass, I bet we would get a lot more people to come to Mass. I go on to say, that the Eucharist is worth even more than a million dollars. It is not as rare as you can receive Communion (as long as you don't have mortal sin on your soul) in almost any Catholic Church on any given Sunday (or Saturday evening). However, the worth of the Eucharist, of coming into physical contact with Jesus, with God Himself, is worth an infinite amount. Just as someone who found a treasure in a field worth more than his combined wealth will obviously use everything at his disposal to purchase the field, we too should use everything at our disposal to receive the treasure of a relationship with Jesus Christ, especially in the Eucharist. I too need to remind myself how awesome it is to have a relationship with Jesus Christ and to be able to receive Him body, blood, soul, and divinity in the Eucharist.

St. John Vianney lived in the 19th century and was a parish priest in the French countryside. He was a simple and humble man, but his reputation as a confessor and pastor of souls made him known by Christians throughout the world. People traveled from around the world to see him, and he was known to spend 16 hours a day hearing confessions. Below are some quotes to meditate on in honor of his feast day, Aug. 4:

"All the good works in the world are not equal to the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass because they are the works of men; but the Mass is the work of God. Martyrdom is nothing in comparison for it is but the sacrifice of man to God; but the Mass is the sacrifice of God for man."

"I tell you that you have less to suffer in following the cross than in serving the world and its pleasures."

"In your work, offer your difficulties and troubles quite simply to God... and you will find that His blessing will rest upon you and on all you do."

St. John Vianney is the patron saint of parish priests, so take time today to thank your priest for giving his life in service to the Body of Christ.
