Hello,

A couple of cool things are going on in our parishes. This weekend (Saturday, October 3), Charlie Caven is receiving his First Communion. Please pray for him that he may grow in love of Jesus and receiving Jesus Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity in the Eucharist.

Then on Sunday (October 4) we welcome into the Body of Christ, Blair Loretta Davis, daughter of Michael and Liza Davis. What a glorious day for both Charlie and Blair!

We still need a new administrator and bookkeeper. So if you know of anyone, please let us know. Also, we are starting an Adult Outreach position trying to make sure that we do a better job of ministering to those who are not in school any more.

Today we hear the parable of the wicked tenants. The master of the vineyard sends three of his servants to obtain his produce from the fields. The kill two of them and beat the third up. The master sends more servants and they get treated the same way. Finally the master sends his own son. The wicked tenants kill him as well with added vengeance because they believe that they can acquire the son's inheritance if he is gone. Again, Jesus is speaking to the chief priests and the elders of the people. They haven't personally, at least not yet, but their forefathers tortured and killed many of the prophets that God sent to His people, the Israelites. In the parable, these prophets are represented by the servants, the servants God sends the tenants. However, Jesus predicts that this generation of chief priests and elders will do one worse; they will kill the Son of God. Jesus is represented by the son the master finally sends, which the evil tenants also kill. So again, Jesus is predicting His death on the Cross at the hands of the chief priests and the elders. However, 2000 years later, we are not innocent. We too have put Jesus to death with our sins. In what ways have we "killed" Jesus, removed Jesus, from our own lives and the lives of those around us?
