	If in-person, how are you handling safety requirements? Space, masks, Catechists?
1	To be determined by the public school that we rent.
2	Masks will be required. Program will be split in half - Groups A and B will come on alternate weeks. Classes will be small, no more than 10 children per class. Windows will be opened. No sharing of materials-children will bring books to class along with pencils. Nothing will be collected from the children.
3	Dividing classes in half where they go every other week.
4	The review and orientation classes will be held in Heritage Hall with no more than 15 people at a time. Everyone will be socially distanced and masks will be worn.
5	We are going to have different sessions, once a month, where we gather each grade and a parent, as to make sure we are following the number of people allowed in an indoor facility, and of course continuing to wear masks. Catechists are assigned usually to each grade, so I will invite them to join, but I will be leading the in-person sessions, as they are doing most work at home with their families, and the gathering will be to review and build community.
6	All regulations will be observed. No more than 5 kids per classroom, mask, and washing hands will be implemented.

29	Whatever guideline the public school puts in place we will follow. We have a special needs school renting our school building, so whatever precautions they put into place we will follow, as well. As of now the special needs school is setting up classrooms to have a personal space "box" around each student's desk. Desks are 6 feet apart and can fit 11-12 students in classroom, which is fine for our population. Once students are in classroom with 6 feet distance, masks can be removed, while sitting at their desks.
30	We use St. Anthony's School and will follow their established protocols and guidelines already in place.
31	Temperatures, masks, social distancing with smaller classes, regular disinfecting, reporting directly to classroom (not common area), one door for ingress and egress, hall monitors, no water fountains, and cleaning lavatory after every use.

33	We are dividing the 9th and 10th grades into semesters and then dividing the class into two nights, to make sure we have the space, all will be required to wear masks.

1	Confirmation was held on June 29. Need to determine how Communion will be handled.
2	7/24 - Confirmation, 7/25 - First Communion
3	Communions rescheduled for September & Confirmation done by our pastor next week.
4	Three Confirmation Liturgies are planned: Aug 7, Aug 8, Dec 4. First Communion will also be 3 liturgies Oct 10, and 2 on Oct 17.

5	Right now, we will be reaching out to our families with a date of Saturday, October 24th where there will be a Morning and Afternoon Mass for families to choose. If they do not feel comfortable, or that does not work, we will look at another Weekend Mass, or they can join with the 2021 Communions. We are fortunate that we have a smaller parish, so we would be able to accommodate a family at a regular weekend Mass (just the immediate family) not extended invites.
6	Our Communions/Confirmation ceremonies took place in July.
7	Oct-20
8	We are holding 2 first Communions Friday evening July 24 limited to 12 families (8 people Max per family. We scheduled 5 Confirmation Masses for October (15 families per Mass, and Fr. Giovanni will be the celebrant)
9	they have been rescheduled for this summer and fall
10	they are scheduled for October
11	We have been celebrating the Sacraments in smaller groups and will continue into September
12	Instead of 1 Confirmation of 42, there will be 4 with limited attendance. Communion, 66 students, 6 services with 11 students and limited guests-masks, socially distant, etc. Immediate family only. We have begun holding these masses.
13	We are offering 7 masses (5 outside) for Communion beginning Aug. 1, and 2 Confirmation dates (7/31 & 8/14), plus they can opt for joining either of the next 2 regularly scheduled (Oct. 2020 - 10th grade & Spring 2021 - 9th grade)
14	Summer offerings. 10 masses limited to 12 communicants and their immediate families fully masked.
15	Our Confirmation is scheduled for early fall. At this time we are not sure yet. We may postpone it to later in the school year. Still discussing this.

17	Confirmation scheduled for September 12 private Mass; First Holy Communion September 19 private Mass
18	Confirmation is October 3, 2020. Children will celebrate first Communion in August and mid-Fall of this year.
