Thank you to the Elmwood Altar and Rosary Society for the wonderful birthday celebration last Saturday! It was very festive with the beautiful decorations and delicious cake and ice cream. *Thanks, too, to Arnie Bauer, Sr., for providing the entertainment!* And *thank you to everyone who sent such thoughtful cards, words of encouragement, assurances of prayers, and gifts.* I am deeply touched by your kindness. Be assured of my prayers for you!

This Lent our parishes are offering a variety of opportunities for you to respond to the call of the Lord: "Come to me!" There are more than **30 hours of Confessions** scheduled throughout the season. As Pope Francis recently said, "Don't be afraid of Confession!" I am offering three presentations on *coming to know Jesus through the Scriptures and the Holy Land* (Mondays, 7:00 PM, March 2, 9, and 16). Our parishes' *day of reflection* is Saturday, March 14, 9:00 AM-3:00 PM featuring Deacons Kevin Ray and Michael Cullen. *Stations of the Cross* are prayed every Tuesday (7:00 PM at Spring Valley) and Friday (7:30 PM Elmwood). **Morning Prayer** is prayed after the 8:00 AM Thursday Mass at Spring Valley. There are excellent free online resources for adults and children for every day of Lent. *Please visit our website svcatholic.org for all the details of these and other offerings this Lent.*

A *commissioned extraordinary minister of Holy Communion* is a lay person truly suited to, carefully prepared for, and duly commissioned by temporary deputation to carry out – in the absence of ordinary ministers (Bishop, Priest, or Deacon) or an instituted Acolyte – the ministry of distributing Holy Communion at Mass or other liturgical functions, bringing Holy Communion to the infirm or Viaticum to the dying, and publicly exposing and reposing the Blessed Sacrament for the adoration of the faithful. Are you currently an extraordinary minister of Holy Communion? Do you currently distribute Holy Communion at Mass or to the homebound or institutionalized? Is the Lord calling you now to this service? *A workshop for all current and new extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion of all three parishes* will be offered on two different occasions this week: **Thursday, February 26, at 7:00 PM at Spring Valley and Saturday, February 28, at 10:30 AM at Elmwood.** You need attend only one of these 90-minute sessions. *Because the workshop is not simply a "how-to" seminar, anyone is welcome to attend. If you want a refresher on what we believe regarding the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist, this is for you!* Some of the topics to be covered in the first hour include: *What is Holy Communion? Who may receive Holy Communion? How is Holy Communion to be distributed: on the tongue or in the hand, communicant kneeling or standing, under both forms? What is the difference between an ordinary and extraordinary minister of Holy Communion? The workshop concludes with training in the practicalities of being an extraordinary minister. If you are unable to attend, please contact the Central Office.*

A *commissioned reader* is a lay person truly suited to, carefully prepared for, and duly commissioned by temporary deputation to carry out the ministry of proclaiming in the liturgical assembly "the readings from Sacred Scripture, with the exception of the Gospel . . . (and who in the absence of the Deacon) may also announce the intentions for the Universal Prayer and, in the absence of a Psalmist, recite the Psalm between the readings" (*General Instruction of the Roman Missal Third Typical Edition*, 99). Are you currently a reader at the Mass of the Lord's Day or during the week? Is the Lord calling you to proclaim His word in the liturgical assembly? *A workshop for all current and new readers of all three parishes* will be offered on two different occasions: **Thursday, March 26, at 7:00 PM at Spring Valley and Saturday, March 28, at 10:30 AM at Boyceville.** You need attend only one of these 90-minute sessions. *Because this workshop is not simply a "how-to" seminar, anyone is welcome to attend. If you want a refresher regarding the Sacred Scriptures, this is for you!* Some topics to be covered in the first hour include: *What is divine revelation and how is Jesus its mediator and fullness? How is this divine revelation transmitted? Why should the Bible be read in light of the liturgy? What does it mean that the Bible is true? What are the scriptural components of the Mass? What is the difference between a reader and a lector? Why does the Deacon do certain things and the reader others? The workshop concludes with training in the practicalities of being a reader. If you are unable to attend, please contact the Central Office.*
