First Sunday of Advent

In a way, we people of faith are amphibians, made to live our lives in two worlds. But where frogs and salamanders live their dual live consecutively; we live ours simultaneously. Meant for life in Heaven, yet we still find ourselves here on earth. And there is probably no time we feel our dual existence more intensely than Advent.

You see, **part of us is** being pulled into “the Holidays” and **is glad** for it. It’s getting cold, the nights are long, the drudgery of Winter is beginning to get to us--and it’s barely started. From our ancestors we’ve learned the therapy of shaking our fist at Winter. The harvest is in, the larder is full, life has been good so we face the burning hearth and turn our backs to the wind. Christmas is lighten-up time. One month out of twelve we give ourselves permission to go to parties on weeknights and decorate our homes like parade floats. It’s the season of eggnog, evergreens and peppermint, when the instinct to purchase is hallowed and overeating is required. Whatever else may be going on in the world, it’s time for nostalgia, over-indulgence and, warmth. Admit it, you feel the pull already and it’s good, it means you’re alive.

But from deep inside a little voice clears its throat and waits to be heard. “But,” it says, “Remember last year?” From this side, Christmas looks like a beautiful balloon to carry us away but come January 2nd we discover it was only a lovely parachute, keeping our feet off the ground for a while, but finally letting us down and covering the same old landscape, the same old problems, with a thin skin of colorful silk. God knows, if you’ve been through that yourself, then you know, too, that you cannot get well until you admit you are sick. That you cannot put your life back together again until you stop pretending it’s not broken. That you can’t find your new beginning until you say, **out loud**, that you’ve come to the end of your rope. The old world must end, in some fashion or other, before a new world can begin.

So, as the darkness gets longer, the Church, once again out of step, rummages for words of hope and responsibility. Faith is neither a cocoon to insulate us from the sufferings of this present age nor a pair of earplugs to shut out the groaning around us. We dig out the still unfulfilled promises of the prophets and say, “Come, Oh Lord, act now, act in us.” For, you see the Gospel is Good News not because we know what the future holds but because we know who holds the future. We have confidence, not because we know exactly what tomorrow will be... but because we know that, in Christ, God does not give up on the world. The proper posture, then, is not to turn our backs to the world but to raise our heads. Remember, God needs our “yes” as much as Mary’s was needed.
