**Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

St. John, in his first letter, said: “If someone says, ‘I love God,’ and hates his brother, he is a liar; for he who does not love his brother whom he has seen, how can he love God whom he has not seen?” (4:20) and on the night before Jesus died He gave His disciples a new commandment to “love one another as I have loved you,” (John 15:12).

The Golden Rule, “Love your neighbor as yourself” (Luke 10:27) which we hear in today’s gospel is not just a Christian thing. Every conceivable religion and culture in the world has the Golden Rule in one form or another. Here is a sampling:

Judaism: “What is hateful to you; do not to your fellow man. That is the law: all the rest is commentary.”

Islam: “No one of you is a believer until he desires for his brother that which he desires for himself.”

Hinduism: “This is the sum of duty: do naught unto others which would cause you pain if done to you.”

Buddhism: “Hurt not others in ways that you yourself would find hurtful.”

Confucianism: “Do not unto others what you would not have them do unto you.

The Golden Rule is understood differently in different religions and cultures. And the key to its understanding lies in the question that the lawyer asks Jesus in today’s gospel, “Who is my neighbor?” (v. 29) and Jesus gave the Parable of the Good Samaritan. The Parable of the Good Samaritan is one of the passages in the Bible that is quite familiar to each one of us. Priests, teachers and even our parents would use this story to teach us the value of compassion, love and mercy to others.

But in some way we could not blame the Jewish priest and Levite (deacon) in the story that did not want to go near the poor man who had been attacked because they thought that he might be dead, and contact with a dead body might have made them ritually impure according to the Mosaic Law. The Law of Moses kept them from keeping the law of love! On another occasion Jesus had taught, “Man was not made for the Sabbath; the Sabbath was made for man.” Or else the priest and Levite just did not want to get involved!

The parable started when a lawyer asked Jesus, ‘Who is my neighbor’ and Jesus responded by telling this beautiful story of a man who fell and was attacked by robbers along the road to Jericho. The road to Jericho from Jerusalem was a notoriously road. It was a road of narrow, rocky defiles and of sudden turnings which made it happy hunting ground for robbers.

“Who is my neighbor?”

Webster Dictionary: “Someone who is near to us, either physically or socially or perhaps in one’s affection.” When we are commanded to love our neighbor in this kind of neighbor, then, it is very easy to love them.

Essenes of Qumran: Neighbor is the one who shares the same religious persuasion as themselves.

Zealots: Only those who shared the same nationality and ethnicity with them.

Average Jew: Their fellow Jews only who are well and in good standing within the Jewish community and would not regard the Samaritan as a neighbor. They are outsiders and circle of neighborly love does not include them.

But for Jesus: Neighbor means anyone of any nation who is in need regardless of his/her status in life. Another one is: it is he/she who does not hesitate to extend a helping hand when it is sorely needed is a neighbor to the person in need.

The whole message of today’s gospel is that the Good Samaritan is no other than Jesus Christ Himself and the one being robbed are ourselves. But anyone of us can and should be Good Samaritans anywhere, in whatever situation. There is really no way of telling where and when God will call us to be a Good Samaritan.
