From Pastor's desk: Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time 2018.

Reflection: Mark 4, 26 – 34: *It is the smallest of all seeds and becomes the largest of plants.*

Happy father's Day to all fathers, we can look to God our Almighty Father, as the ideal of a fostering, loving, forgiving parent. Today's Gospel reading features the final two stories pointing to the Reign of God in the collection found in the everyday mystery of the growth of seed, and the other about the mustard plant shrieks with exaggeration and irony. Who in these stories is the farmer? Is it God or us? Perhaps, the farmer is Jesus, who will return at the Second Coming to bring in the harvest. But where is Jesus the farmer now, between the sowing and the harvest, when our days are marked by struggle and suffering, and we long for evidence of his presence? For this reason, we consider that the Kingdom of God is both already but not yet. Scripture often uses trees and plants as symbols of God's action in the lives of the Israelites and, in Jesus' ministry, to describe how the kingdom of God works. God invites us to participate in divine action, and includes care for the plants of the earth as well as the whole globe.

God of abundant life, you have showered us with plentiful gifts. Guide our efforts to share the resources of the world, especially with those who hunger and thirst for righteousness.

Desde el escritorio del Pastor: Undécimo Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario 2018.

Reflexión: Marcos 4, 26 - 34: *Es la más pequeña de todas las semillas y se convierte en la más grande de las plantas.*

Feliz día del padre para todos los padres, podemos mirar a Dios, nuestro Padre Todopoderoso, como el ideal de un padre bondadoso, amoroso e indulgente. La lectura del Evangelio de hoy presenta las últimas dos historias que apuntan al Reino de Dios en la colección encontrada en el misterio cotidiano del crecimiento de la semilla, y la otra sobre la planta de la mostaza chilla con exageración e ironía. ¿Quién en estas historias es el agricultor? ¿Es Dios o nosotros? Tal vez, el granjero es Jesús, quien regresará en la Segunda Venida para traer la cosecha. Pero, ¿dónde está Jesús el agricultor ahora, entre la siembra y la cosecha, cuando nuestros días están marcados por la lucha y el sufrimiento, y anhelamos la evidencia de su presencia? Por esta razón, consideramos que el Reino de Dios ya está pero todavía no. La Escritura a menudo usa árboles y plantas como símbolos de la acción de Dios en las vidas de los israelitas y, en el ministerio de Jesús, para describir cómo funciona el reino de Dios. Dios nos invita a participar en la acción divina e incluye el cuidado de las plantas de la tierra y de todo el globo.

Dios de la vida abundante, nos has llenado de abundantes regalos. Guíe nuestros esfuerzos para compartir los recursos del mundo, especialmente con aquellos que tienen hambre y sed por justicia.
