### From the Deacon's Bench

Brothers and Sisters,

About 1600 years ago, St. Augustine of Hippo wrote: "Bad times, hard times, this is what people keep saying; but let us live well, and times shall be good. We are the times: such as we are, such are the times."

In his lifetime, St. Augustine saw the Church fighting heresy and the Roman Empire crumbling as barbarian tribes sacked the city of Rome. He and the people, the Church, of his time had indeed witnessed "Bad times, hard times." We could echo those thoughts today. "Bad times, hard times, this is what people keep saying; but let us live well, and times shall be good. We are the times: such as we are, such are the times." Let's face it, our world is more than a little troubled. But let's not despair.

Instead, this week let's look at how we can "live well." Let's consider, "We are the times: such as we are, such are the times." After three Sundays of parables about building up the Kingdom, our readings today are words of encouragement. Isaiah writes, "All you who are thirsty, come to the water!" and "Come to me heedfully, listen, that you may have life." St. Paul writes, "For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor present things, nor future things, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord." And the Gospel tells of Jesus' care for those who follow Him as He feeds the five thousand. (It was probably more like eight to ten thousand counting the women and children. I personally believe that they were His first concern.) Let's make the time to reflect on these readings in the coming week.
