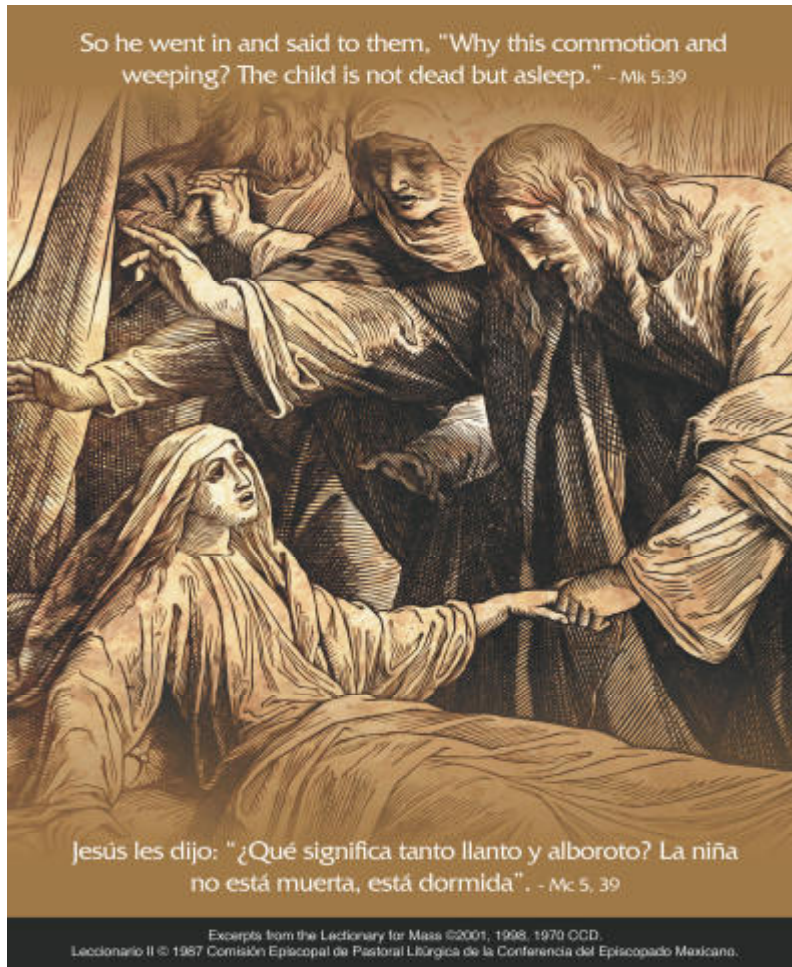

FROM THE DESK OF FATHER PAVINO

On June 29 we are celebrating the feast day of St. Peter and St. Paul, which is a solemnity. They are both considered as pillars of Christian faith. Peter was a fisherman by trade, he was uneducated and he was living a secular life. While Paul was a Pharisee, highly educated in scripture and considered as belonging to a religious group. Peter and Paul were so different and the only one thing that was common to them was they were both Jews, belonging to the Chosen People of God. As such, they were both waiting for the coming of the Messiah.

What was amazing was Jesus Christ called them both to become His Apostle. Amazing in the sense that it would seem that neither one of them was qualified to become an Apostle of Christ, at least in the standard of the world. Peter was a mere fisherman while Paul was an enemy of Christian faith. This only shows that God does not look at what we are now but, God looks at what we can become. Who would have thought that a simple catcher of fish would become the first pope, and an ardent persecutor of Christianity would become a strong pillar of the faith he was once persecuting.

Looking at the confession of Peter in the Gospel according to Matthew, when Jesus asked him what does he think about Him, Peter said: YOU ARE THE CHRIST, THE SON OF THE LIVING GOD (Mt. 16:13-19). For Peter, Jesus is the future and not the past. We must understand that the Israelites were all waiting for the Messiah hoping that the Messiah would restore the glory of the kingdom of Israel. To Peter, Jesus is more than the hope of a return to a golden age. Jesus as the Messiah is the final destination of the Chosen People of God.

Brothers and sisters, during the height of the pandemic people were hoping to get back and return to their previous life, when they could go outdoors and have fun, when there were no restrictions, no social distancing, no limit in the number of gatherings ... Now, we are starting to slow down, if not totally stop the spread of the virus. Do we want to go back to where we were? Or, like St. Peter, view Christ as our future and final destination. The challenge now is to move on ... to go forward. This is what I see in our parish ... we have so much to look forward to. We must not dwell on the past but hold onto our future, who is Christ! Live for the future ... Live for Christ!

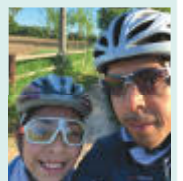

¿Por qué el Domingo es el Día del Señor?

El domingo es el día de la resurrección de Cristo. Los Católicos los celebramos con la Santa Misa y cumplimos con el Tercer Mandamiento del Decálogo. El Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica nos dirá: "La Iglesia, desde la tradición apostólica que tiene su origen en el mismo día de la resurrección de Cristo, celebra el misterio pascual cada ocho días, en el día que se llama con razón "día del Señor" o domingo. El día de la Resurrección de Cristo es a la vez el "primer día de la semana", memorial del primer día de la creación, y el "octavo día" en que Cristo, tras su "reposo" del gran Sabbat, inaugura el Día "que hace el Señor", el "día que no conoce ocaso". El "banquete del Señor" es su centro, porque es aquí donde toda la comunidad de los fieles encuentra al Señor resucitado que los invita a su banquete... Para los cristianos vino a ser el primero de todos los días, la primera de todas las fiestas, el día del Señor ("Hé kyriaké héméra", "dies dominica"), el "domingo". Es mediante la Resurrección del Señor que el domingo es establecido como el día privilegiado, como el día de la Reconciliación. Desde el tiempo del Nuevo Testamento (tiempos Apostólicos), el domingo reemplazó al sábado judío como día dedicado al Señor para darle culto y descansar de las labores. La Iglesia católica no "cambia la Biblia", como dicen algunas sectas que se aferran al sábado. Es un hecho histórico que desde el principio (desde el siglo I) los cristianos celebran el día del Señor el domingo. La Iglesia es fiel a la doctrina de los Apóstoles.

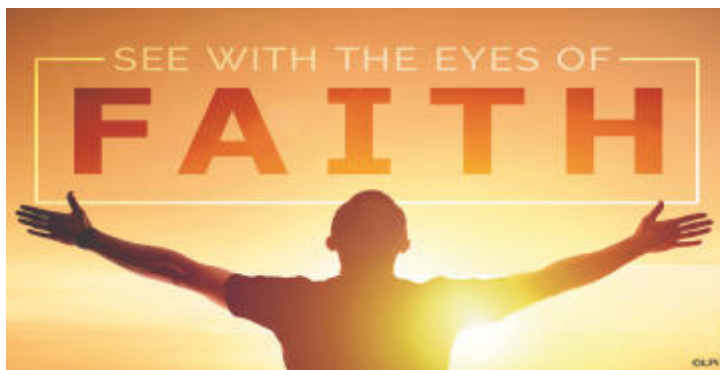
La transferencia del día del Señor del sábado, séptimo día, al domingo (día primero de la semana) ocurrió en tiempo de los apóstoles con motivo de la resurrección de Jesucristo. El domingo Cristo resucita, vence la muerte y completa la obra redentora. Si bien el séptimo día (sábado) Dios "descansó" al fin de la creación, el domingo es el día en que todo es re-creado en Jesucristo. Ahora es posible el culto a Dios en espíritu y en verdad.

Además, el domingo es el día de Pentecostés, en que estaban reunidos los Apóstoles con María Santísima en oración y se derramó el Espíritu Santo.

Al celebrar el domingo somos fieles a Jesucristo. El no vino a abolir el Antiguo Testamento sino a darle cumplimiento con su muerte y resurrección. Todo se cumple en El. Vemos en muchos textos como Jesucristo, para dar cumplimiento, presenta la ley antigua en una nueva forma que sorprende a sus oyentes por su novedad y exigencia. La ley queda perfeccionada en Cristo.

El día de la Resurrección: la nueva creación

Jesús resucitó de entre los muertos "el primer día de la semana" (Mt 28, 1; Mc 16, 2; Lc 24, 1; Jn 20, 1). En cuanto es el "primer día", el día de la Resurrección de Cristo recuerda la primera creación. En cuanto es el "octavo día", que sigue al sábado (Mc 16, 1; Mt 28, 1), significa la nueva creación inaugurada con la resurrección de Cristo. Para los cristianos vino a ser el primero de todos los días, la primera de todas las fiestas, el día del Señor (*Hè kyriakè héméra, dies dominica*), el "domingo *plenitud del sábado*".
