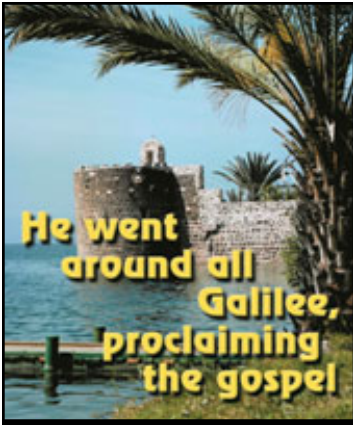

## Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

*"The Lord is my light and my salvation." - - Psalm 27*

### LIBERATION AND REFORM

While you might have to reach for an atlas to determine that Isaiah is speaking about Galilee, today's first reading (part of which was read at Christmas) is prophetic of Jesus' future ministry in that province. The light that brings salvation and rejoicing is, ultimately, Christ. Liberation is the theme: liberation from both ignorance ("darkness") and sin (the "yoke"). As Isaiah identifies a place, so Paul describes an attitude: the attitude that develops, even among good people, of equating their own will with the common good. This always brings dissension, and so it has done in Corinth. Paul will not allow this; we are all members of "Christ's party." The gospel is not to divide us. Matthew quotes from Isaiah in today's Gospel, presenting Jesus as the fulfillment of Isaiah's prophecies. The theme is "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand" (Matthew 4:17). To spread this message, Jesus begins to select disciples, four of whom we meet today: Peter, Andrew, James, and John. Copyright (c) J. S. Paluch Co., Inc.

### FROM THE ORDINARY

When Matthew turns to the call of the first disciples of Jesus, it is striking how ordinary these men were. Jesus does not recruit "the best and the brightest" as his core team. The four disciples named here had little or no education, no special breeding, no influence in high places. They had ordinary jobs in ordinary places. But this is often how God works, throughout the story of God and the Chosen People in the Bible. Remember the call of ordinary folks like Abraham, Moses, David, Mary, and many others. Today we are reminded that God loves us and calls us just as we are, where we are, in the present. God doesn't ask us to become somehow more acceptable ahead of time, in order to draw near to God. We are called by God to be partners and disciples, and God will teach us along the way. Wherever we are in our lives, God calls us from our ordinariness, to join our hearts with the divine Heart, and to join God in the work that must be done. Copyright (c) J. S. Paluch Co., Inc.

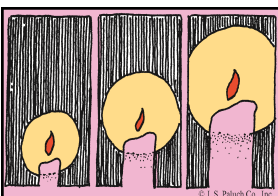

**Feast of the Presentation of the Lord**

Thursday, February 2nd

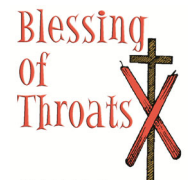
The Church celebrates the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord (originally known as the Feast of the Purification of the Blessed Virgin). Mary travels with Joseph to the temple to be "purified" in accordance with Mosaic Law, and to dedicate the child Jesus to the Lord - the "light of the world".

This feast celebrates the fortieth day after the birth of Christ, and this symbol of forty days is the reason for the feast's traditional importance and for the practice of blessing candles for use in the church and in our homes. Mass on this day is also called the Candle Mass (Candlemas) in reference to the blessing of the candles. You are invited to bring candles from home to have them blessed at this special 8 am Mass.

**Feast of St. Blaise**

Friday, February 3rd

Saint Blaise was bishop of Sebaste in Armenia in the fourth century, and is venerated as the patron saint of those who suffer from diseases of the throat. The traditional Blessing of Throats will be offered at the 8 am Mass.

### Msgr. Flaherty New Diocesan Administrator

On January 4th, Bishop Parkes was installed as the new bishop of the Diocese of St. Petersburg. But what does it mean for us when our bishop is transferred? When a diocese finds itself between bishops, a diocesan administrator is appointed to lead the diocese during the interim. Msgr. Flaherty, who has been a part of the diocese since 1977 and has served under all five bishops, was appointed the diocesan administrator of the Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee. Msgr. Flaherty said that the process of selecting a new bishop could take anywhere from a few months to a year, but for those who are anxious about the lack of a bishop in our diocese, he said this: "We are faithful disciples of Jesus. We are the church fully alive, and when a new bishop comes, we will welcome him with joy." Congratulations, Msgr. Flaherty!
