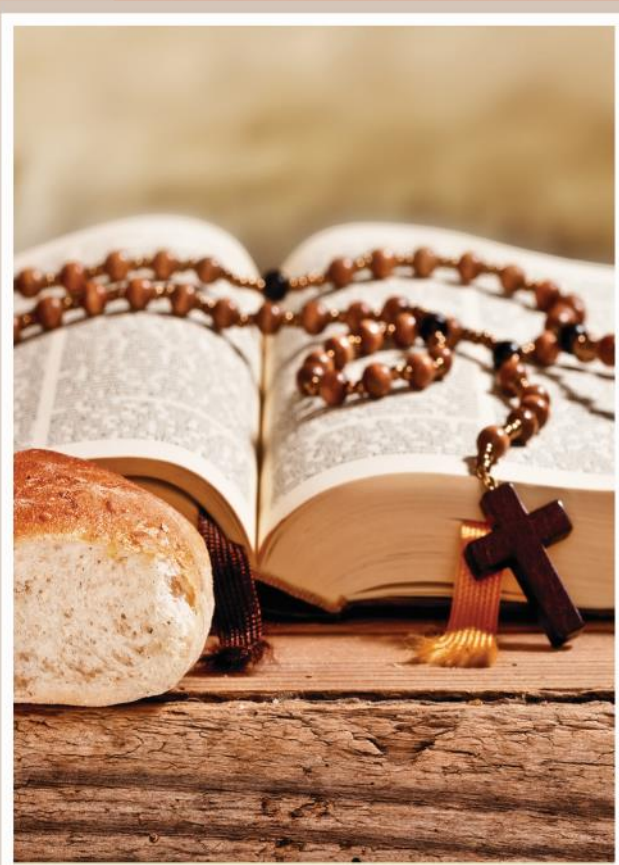

New Catholic High School for Students with Special Needs

The Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee announces the opening of a new Catholic high school for students with special needs. Morning Star High School of Pensacola, opening in August 2020, will be an independent institution located on the campus of Pensacola Catholic High School, 3043 W. Scott Street. Morning Star High School of Pensacola will provide a faith-filled Catholic education to students with special needs in the Pensacola community. Tuition is expected to be \$12,500 per year. The McKay Scholarship Program or the Gardiner Scholarship Program may be applied toward tuition. Start-up costs to provide a faith-based, inclusive Catholic education for these high school-aged students in our diocese are estimated to be at least \$200,000. To date, pledges have exceeded \$186,000. Once the goal is met, the overage will help offset additional operational costs and provide scholarships for families who can't afford the full tuition rate. The governance, operations, location, and facilities considerations have already begun, but the diocese needs your help to make this school a reality. Please consider being a founding donor of this school by making an investment in the life of children in our local Catholic family. There are currently two elementary/middle school Morning Star programs in the diocese: Sacred Heart Cathedral School and St. John the Evangelist Catholic School. Both are located in Pensacola.
