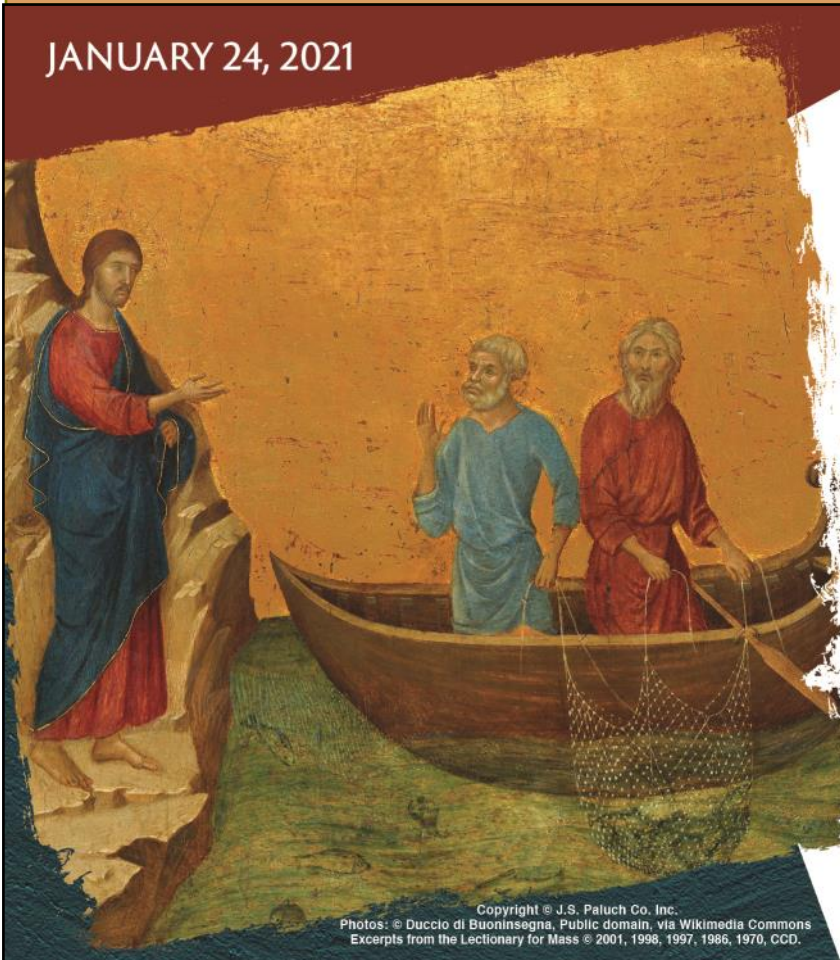

**February 2, 2021 at 2:00 pm through February 3, 2021**

## YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH



On December 8, 2020, the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Pope Pius IX's proclamation declaring St. Joseph as the Patron of the Catholic Church, Pope Francis instituted 2021 as the Year of St. Joseph, Patron of the Universal Church. During this year we will look to St. Joseph as a role model and example for us as members of the Church to follow. In the same way that St. Joseph cared for Jesus and Mary so we believe he cares for us. This will give us an opportunity to recognize the virtues and gifts which allowed St. Joseph to fulfill his call as the protector of our Lord and protector/patron of the Church.

In his Apostolic Letter *Patris Cordel*, [http://www.vatican.va/content/francesco/en/apost\\_letters/index.html](http://www.vatican.va/content/francesco/en/apost_letters/index.html), Pope Francis begins: "With a Father's heart: that is how Joseph loved Jesus, whom all four Gospels refer to as 'the son of Joseph.'" It is with this same heart that Joseph is entrusted with the love and care of all the world.

What makes Joseph a model for us and the patron of our Church? One of his most outstanding virtues is St. Joseph's sense of justice. He was a just man who took Mary into his home to be his wife. In response to the word of an angel, St. Joseph did not subject Mary to public scrutiny regarding the paternity of her child. He trusted in the words of the angel and took Mary into his home and raised Jesus as his son. We too are called to be men and women of justice. Having St. Joseph as the model brings us back to our Baptismal commitment and what our Baptism calls us to as Catholics.

St. Joseph has the special grace and privilege of being the spouse of Mary and the foster father of Jesus. In his encyclical *Quamquam Pluries*, Pope Leo XIII highlights St. Joseph's holiness and special position as protector of the Holy Family: "Joseph...indeed was the husband of Mary and the (foster) father...of Jesus Christ. From this arise all his dignity and grace, holiness and glory...Joseph alone stands out in august dignity because he was the Guardian of the Son of God by divine appointment." (QP, 28) By the very nature of his appointment as guardian of Jesus, Joseph becomes our guardian and protector.

The word patron comes from the Latin *pater*, *father*. St. Joseph's holiness and sense of justice putting his total trust in God's promise has given him the honor of being Jesus' foster father and therefore our father. It is this title of Patron that we honor and celebrate in 2021. We can look to St. Joseph as the example of what it means to say "yes" to God's will. Joseph, like Mary, gave his *fiat*, his yes, to God. It is justice and holiness that we are called to emulate. We too are called by Baptism to give our "yes", our *fiat* to God.

In these days of uncertainty and unrest it is our call to bring peace and hope to the world and our families by imitating St. Joseph in all his ways, all his virtues. Throughout this year we are encouraged to discover the various gifts and virtues of this great saint and see how we can apply them to our lives in the 21<sup>st</sup> century.

There are many devotions that will aid in this year's celebration of St. Joseph ranging from the Litany to St. Joseph to a novena in his honor. ## Sacraments

**Baptism** - Arrangements for baptism must be made in advance, and preparation is required prior to scheduling the date. Call Karen at 623-3600 ext. 101.

**Confession** - Confession is held in the Chapel every Saturday from 1:30 pm to 3:00 pm, or by appointment by calling 850-623-3600.

**First Monday Confession** - First Monday of each month from 5:30 pm to 7 pm in the Chapel.

**Sacrament of Marriage** - Marriage preparation must begin at least six months prior to the date of the wedding. Call the office to make an appointment with one of our priests.

**Anointing of the Sick** - Anointing is administered to bring spiritual strength and healing during an illness, before surgery or procedures, and especially near time of death. Call the parish office to make arrangements.

### **Assistance for Victims of Sexual Abuse**

If you are a victim of abuse, or you suspect a child or a vulnerable adult is being abused by anyone, call the Florida Abuse Hotline at 1-800-96-ABUSE (1-800-962-2873). To report abuse within the Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee involving a priest, deacon or other church personnel, you may also call the Diocesan Abuse Reporting Hotline at 850-435-3536 or report via email to: bishopsoffice@ptdiocese.org. Please include your first and last name, your contact information and how you would prefer to be contacted. The Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee encourages anyone aware of abuse by a priest, deacon or church personnel **to make a report immediately**. Your report enables us to better ensure the safety of all and to help individuals in the healing process. All information supplied is maintained in strictest confidence, except where disclosure is required by law. According to Florida law, all are considered "mandatory reporters" of abuse and must report the abuse of a child or a vulnerable adult.
