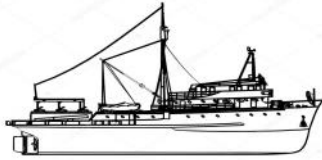

THE SIGNIFICANCE OF THE ASCENSION



The theological unity, or perhaps even the temporal experience of the early community, made it seem that Jesus' resurrection and his ascension were inseparable aspects of a single mystery. Only in the later writings of Luke and John has further theological reflection helped the Christian community to distinguish different dimensions of the mystery.

Liturgical tradition has followed the forty-day chronology formulated by Luke. We would miss the point, however, if we were to demand a precise historical chronology of events such as the Resurrection-Ascension that are primarily spiritual in nature and that clearly surpass the bounds of time and space as we know them.

What is important for us to grasp is the significance of the Ascension. For Luke, it is the decisive turning point that marks the end of Jesus' earthly ministry and the beginning of the disciples' Spirit-led ministry and thus the ministry of the whole church down to our own day.

Mary, the Mother of God

As the Mother of God, the Virgin Mary has a unique position among the saints, indeed, among all creatures. She is exalted, yet still one of us.

Redeemed by reason of the merits of her Son and united to Him by a close and indissoluble tie, she is endowed with the high office and dignity of being the Mother of the Son of God, by which account she is also the beloved daughter of the Father and the temple of the Holy Spirit. Because of this gift of sublime grace, she far surpasses all creatures, both in heaven and on earth. At the same time, however, because she belongs to the offspring of Adam she is one with all those who are to be saved. (Lumen Gentium, no. 53)

Mary embraces God's will and freely chooses to cooperate with God's grace, thereby fulfilling a crucial role in God's plan of salvation. Throughout the centuries, the Church has turned to the Blessed Virgin in order to come closer to Christ. Many forms of piety toward the Mother of God developed that help bring us closer to her Son. In these devotions to Mary, "while the Mother is honored, the Son, through whom all things have their being and in whom it has pleased the Father that all fullness should dwell, is rightly known, loved and glorified and . . . all His commands are observed." The Church honors her as the Mother of God, looks to her as a model of perfect discipleship, and asks for her prayers to God on our behalf. -- United States Conference of Catholic Bishops

Sacraments

Baptism - Arrangements for baptism must be made in advance, and preparation is required prior to scheduling the date. Call Karen at 623-3600 ext. 101.

Confession - Confession is held in the Chapel every Saturday from 1:30 pm to 3:00 pm, or by appointment by calling 850-623-3600.

First Monday Confession - First Monday of each month from 5:30 pm to 7 pm in the Chapel.

Sacrament of Marriage - Marriage preparation must begin at least six months prior to the date of the wedding. Call the office to make an appointment with one of our priests.

Anointing of the Sick - Anointing is administered to bring spiritual strength and healing during an illness, before surgery or procedures, and especially near time of death. Call the parish office to make arrangements.

Assistance for Victims of Sexual Abuse

If you are a victim of abuse, or you suspect a child or a vulnerable adult is being abused by anyone, call the Florida Abuse Hotline at 1-800-96-ABUSE (1-800-962-2873). To report abuse within the Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee involving a priest, deacon or other church personnel, you may also call the Diocesan Abuse Reporting Hotline at 850-435-3536 or report via email to: bishopsoffice@ptdiocese.org. Please include your first and last name, your contact information and how you would prefer to be contacted. The Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee encourages anyone aware of abuse by a priest, deacon or church personnel **to make a report immediately**. All information supplied is maintained in strictest confidence, except where disclosure is required by law. According to Florida law, all are considered "mandatory reporters" of abuse and must report the abuse of a child or a vulnerable adult.
