**Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Weekend of August 2/3, 2014** – In today's Gospel we find an equation the disciples of Jesus couldn't solve: Five loaves and two fish divided by 5,000 plus people. They failed to recognize Jesus in the equation; that whatever they had to offer, Jesus could take it and bless it and satisfy the hunger of the crowd with it. Good stewards recognize that the Lord can work miracles with the gifts they offer to a hungry and broken world.
