Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Weekend of October 18/19, 2014 – In today's Gospel we hear proclaimed a profound teaching by Jesus on stewardship. What belongs to Caesar? What belongs to God? Christian stewards recognize that everything they have belongs to God. God created them, and God has claims on every part of their existence. They also realize that the sovereign is an institution whose nature and purpose is to promote the common good and protect the welfare of its citizenry. As long as it accomplishes this mission while treating every single person with deep respect, justice and compassion, it merits the steward's support and cooperation. Christian stewards know what belongs to the Lord, and they are better citizens when they live their lives according to His Gospel.

Cemetery Sunday Collection – October 25/26: Funding for the cemetery is only partially supported by the sale of sites and burial fees. At this time, St. Luke's does not have an endowment for the Cemetery. The Cemetery accounts have a balance of \$26,108.53, a fairly small reserve. Your generous support is appreciated.
