Saint John's Bible Exhibit at Kenyon College: The Saint John's Bible, featuring calligraphy illustrations made from materials including lapis lazuli, malachite, silver and 24-karat gold, was commissioned in 1998. Its seven volumes, holding more that 1,100 pages total, are each 2-feet tall by 3-feet wide. The Heritage Edition is a museum-quality, fine-art reproduction of the original, one of 299 sets made to allow educational, religious and cultural institutions to share the artwork. Artists used goose feather quills and hand-ground inks, but their illuminations are firmly in the 21st century. The books are there to be seen, touched and flipped through. The Saint John's Bible is on display through October 31, from 9am-noon and 1-4pm, Mondays through Fridays in the Greenslade Special Collection & Archives Room of Olin Library, 103 College Drive in Gambier. The Pentateuch and the Gospel will remain until March. Admission is free.
