The bishops said it was OK to go ahead and eat meat on Friday, but it still was important to do something sacrificial on Fridays as a way of keeping sacred the day of the week on which Christ died. Catholics heard the first part. But did we hear the part about volunteering, or fasting for peace, or visiting the sick every Friday? What practices would help you keep the spirit of Friday? If you are retired or your work schedule would accommodate, we need you. Meals are prepared in the licensed kitchen of Danville United Methodist church and ready for delivery at 10:15am and requires from 45 minutes to 1 1/2 hours time Monday through Friday. The time spent delivering meals varies depending on the route you have. Currently we are scheduling 6 routes and delivering 85 to 95 meals per day. Our territory covers the Danville and East Knox school district area--to the county line in four directions. You will be compensated monthly for miles driven and a nominal stipend for your time.
