To commemorate the 50th anniversary of his death, the 5pm Saturday Mass on April 22 will be celebrated by Fr. Jim Colopy, Steve's nephew, and Fr. Vince Nguyen. A graveside service will be held on Sunday, April 23 at 10:15am at St. Luke Catholic Cemetery. Two of Steve's comrades, Larry Kahn and Dan Price, who were on the personnel carrier when it hit the land mine and seriously injured, will attend. The local American Legion will provide a color guard and taps will be played by Brian Ackert. Steve's family wishes to extend an invitation to all who would like to honor his memory.
