**Catechism of the Catholic Church – 2276, 2277, 2278, 2279.**

Those whose lives are diminished or weakened deserve special respect. Sick or handicapped persons should be helped to lead lives as normal as possible.

Whatever its motives and means, direct euthanasia consists in putting an end to the lives of handicapped, sick, or dying persons. It is morally unacceptable.

Discontinuing medical procedures that are burdensome, dangerous, extraordinary, or disproportionate to the expected outcome can be legitimate; it is the refusal of “over-zealous” treatment. Here one does not will to cause death; one’s inability to impede it is merely accepted. The decisions should be made by the patient or he is competent and able or, if not, by those legally entitled to act for the patient, whose reasonable will and legitimate interests must always be respected.

Even if death is thought imminent, the ordinary care owed to a sick person cannot be legitimately interrupted. The use of painkillers to alleviate the sufferings of the dying, even at the risk of shortening their days, can be morally in conformity with human dignity if death is not inevitable. Palliative care is a special form of disinterested charity. As such it should be encouraged.

### **Catholic Response to the 500th Anniversary of the Beginning of the Protestant Reformations:**

On Monday, October 30, Jim Anderson, who works with Marcus Grodi at the Coming Home Network headquartered in Zanesville, Ohio, will speak on the 500<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the publishing of the “95 Theses” by Fr. Martin Luther, on October 31, 1517 which sparked the beginning of the Protestant Reformations. Jim lived in Fulda, Germany in 2012 for 11 months while researching this topic. Jim will discuss for the average person some of the causes of the Protestant Reformations and the corresponding response of the Catholic reformation, the life of Martin Luther and some of the reasons he wrote his Theses, and the effects of the Protestant Reformations down through history up to now to both Catholics as well as Protestants.
