Bi-Monthly Healing Mass on November 20 at Saint Joseph Cathedral: A Mass of Healing and Healing Service will be celebrated on Monday, November 20, 6:30 pm at Saint Joseph Cathedral, 212 East Broad Street, Columbus. Following the Mass, a Service of Healing will begin with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Veneration of relic of the True Cross of Christ, and an opportunity for each person to speak individually with a priest and receive prayers of healing for what they seek. The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick will also be available. The Service of Healing will conclude with Benediction. All persons who seek Christ's healing are invited, especially those who suffer with physical illness and infirmities (e.g. cancer and other debilitating diseases and conditions), and those who seek emotional and spiritual healing. All caregivers, family members, and members of the medical community are invited as well. Parking is available at the rear of the Cathedral accessible off East Gay Street. Handicap accessible elevator is located in the courtyard (west side of the Cathedral) on East Broad Street. Bi-monthly Healing Masses take place at the Cathedral on the third Monday of the month.
