Bi-Monthly Healing Mass at Saint Joseph Cathedral - January 15th: A Mass of Healing and Healing Service will be held 6:30 pm, at 212 East Broad Street, Columbus. Following the Mass, a Service of Healing will begin with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Veneration of relic of the True Cross of Christ, and an opportunity for each person to speak individually with a priest and receive prayers of healing for what they seek. The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick will also be available. The Service of Healing will conclude with Benediction. All persons who seek Christ's healing are invited, especially those who suffer with physical illness and infirmities (e.g. cancer and other debilitating diseases and conditions), and those who seek emotional and spiritual healing. 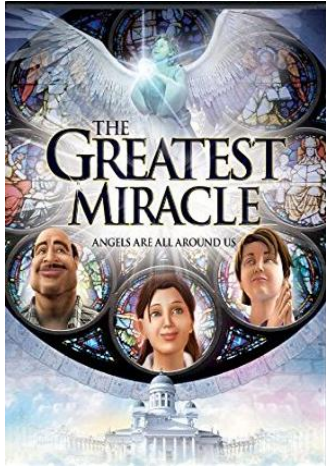

Catechism of the Catholic Church 858: Jesus is the Father’s Emissary. From the beginning of his ministry, he “called to him those whom he desired; . . . And he appointed twelve, whom also he named apostles, to be with him, and to be sent out to preach.” From then on, they would also be his “emissaries” (*Greek apostoloi*). In them, Christ continues his own mission: “As the Father has sent me, even so I send you. The apostles’ ministry is the continuation of his mission: Jesus said to the Twelve: “he who receives you receives me.”
