Have you had your MMR shot? Measles is so easy to catch that 9 out of 10 unprotected people can get it if they are exposed to an infected person. Among those who get measles: 1 in 4 will be hospitalized, 1 in 1,000 will have brain swelling, 1-2 in 1,000 will die. Everyone in your family needs the shot. Catechism of the Catholic Church 1333: At the heart of the Eucharistic celebration are the bread and wine that, by the words of Christ and invocation of the Holy Spirit become Christ’s Body and Blood. Faithful to the Lord’s command the Church continues to do, in his memory and until his glorious return, what he did on the eve of his Passion: “He took bread...” “He took the cup filled with wine...” The signs of bread and wine become, in a way surpassing understanding, the Body and Blood of Christ; they continue also to signify the goodness of creation. Thus, in the Offertory, we give thanks to the Creator for bread and wine, fruit of the “work of human hands,” but above all as “fruit of the earth” and “of the vine” – gifts of the Creator. The Church sees in the gesture of the king-priest Melchizedek, who “brought out bread and wine,” a prefiguring of her own offering.
