**Have you had your MMR shot?** Measles is so easy to catch that 9 out of 10 unprotected people can get it if they are exposed to an infected person. Among those who get measles: 1 in 4 will be hospitalized, 1 in 1,000 will have brain swelling, 1-2 in 1,000 will die. The MMR shot can prevent measles! Everyone in your family needs the shot. To make an appointment at the Community Health Center in either Danville or Mt., Vernon call 740-399-8008. The Health Department visits The Sanctuary in Danville the second Thursday of the month from 3 to 5pm. If you had the measles or if you received 2 MMR in 2014 you do not need a shot.

**Catechism of the Catholic Church 2765:** The traditional expression "the Lord's Prayer" – *oratio Dominica* – means that the prayer to our Father is taught and given to us by the Lord Jesus. The prayer that comes to us from Jesus is truly unique: it is "of the Lord." On the one hand, in the words of this prayer the only Son gives us the words the Father gave him: he is the master of our prayer. On the other, as Word incarnate, he knows in his human heart the needs of his brothers and sisters and reveals them to us: he is the model of our prayer.
