Update of Church Renovations: The pews have been removed and are being stored in a climate-controlled facility. The stained-glass windows have been cleaned and are covered. Plaster has been prepped and repair work is almost done. They have started priming. The ceiling in the choir loft is painted as well as the rib work and around the rose window. It looks beautiful. The confessional is being prepped. Weekly payments are being made with a deposit on flooring, pew covering, and artist for the artwork. There are 7 men working and they are on schedule!

Catechism of the Catholic Church 529: The *presentation of Jesus at the temple* shows him to be the firstborn Son who belongs to the Lord. With Simeon and Anna, all Israel awaits its *encounter* with the Savior – the name given to this event in the Byzantine tradition. Jesus is recognized as the long-expected Messiah, the “light to the nations” and the “glory of Israel,” but also “a sign that is spoken against.” The sword of sorrow predicted for Mary announces Christ’s perfect and unique oblation on the cross that will impart the salvation God had “prepared in the presence of all peoples”
