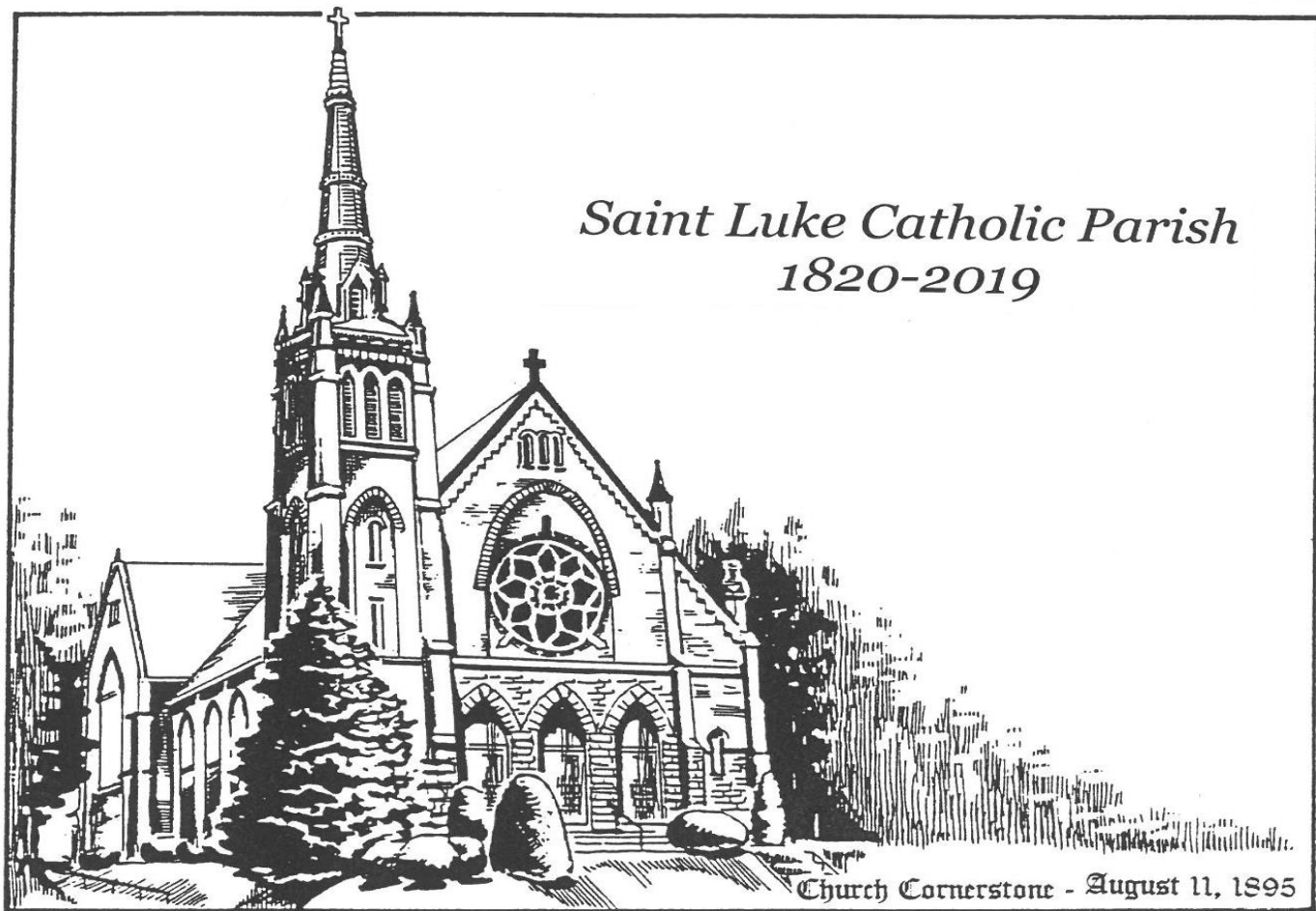

Divine Mercy Corner: In 1931, Our Lord Jesus appeared to a Polish nun, Sister Maria Faustina. Two rays, one pale and one a light red, radiated from His heart. The pale ray symbolized the Water which makes our souls righteous and the red ray symbolized the Blood which is the life of our souls. These two rays issued forth from the very depths of Christ's tender mercy when His agonized heart was opened by a lance on the Cross. Jesus told Sister Faustina to paint the image with the words, "Jesus, I trust in You." He gave her the words for the Chaplet of Divine Mercy. Each Friday during Lent 10 minutes prior to the 7pm Stations of the Cross, the Chaplet of Divine Mercy will be prayed.
