FREE TAX PREPARATION---Sanctuary Community Action in cooperation with Knox County Public Library and AARP Foundation tax-aide volunteers is offering free tax preparation on Wednesday, March 25 at St. Luke Community Center. Appointments are required. This service is provided free to all taxpayers in the community, but special attention is given to those sixty and older and those with low to moderate income. Taxpayers with complex tax returns may be beyond the 'scope' of the program; for example, Schedule C if a loss or expenses exceed \$25,000; Schedule E (rental property) with expenses including depreciation of any type of property; and Schedule F farm income are examples of 'out of scope'. Currently there is a limited number of openings for March 25. **Please call The Sanctuary at 740-599-7224 to schedule or for more information.** Taxpayers must bring photo ID, social security card for person(s) filing and for all dependents as well as your previous years (2019) tax return if you have filed in previous years.
