Please take your temperature before coming and stay at home if you do not feel well. Confessions will be in the Community Center. Plan to arrive 5 minutes early and to wear a face mask or other covering over your nose and mouth. You will enter through the glass lobby door with a Knight there to monitor those going in and out so as not to disrupt one's confession. An area will be designated to stand. Confessions will not be face-to-face. Come, confess your sins, receive penance and absolution. You can do your penance at home. An Act of Contrition will be posted for you to pray.
