11th Sunday in Ordinary Time, June 13, 2021, Real Presence, Real Future reflections: "Seed in the World" presented by Mary Thompson, St. Matthew Gahanna Parishioner & RPRF Commission Member.

In the parable of the sowing of the seed, Jesus reveals the growth of the Kingdom of God through the Church and each one of us. The preaching of the Gospel, the generously sown seed, will unfailingly yield its fruit throughout all ages, including the present time. Catechism of the Catholic Church 543: *Everyone* is called to enter the kingdom. First announced to the children of Israel, this messianic kingdom is intended to accept men of all nations.
