**LifeLine Screening, Thursday, July 29 from 9am to 4pm....**LifeLine Screening, a leading provider of community-based preventive health screenings, will offer their affordable, non-invasive and painless health screenings at St. Luke Community Center on Thursday, July 29. Four vascular screenings will be offered that scan for potential health problems related to: blocked arteries which is a leading cause of stroke; abdominal aortic aneurysms which can lead to a ruptured aorta; hardening of the arteries in the legs which is a strong predictor of heart disease; atrial fibrillation or irregular heartbeat which is closely tied to stroke; additional bone density screening for men and women to assess the risk of osteoporosis. Register for a Wellness Package which includes 4 vascular tests and osteoporosis screening for \$149. All five screenings take 60-90 minutes to complete.
