**LifeLine Screening**, Thursday, July 29 from 9am to 4pm: LifeLine Screening, a leading provider of community-based preventive health screenings, will offer their affordable, non-invasive and painless health screenings at St. Luke Community Center on Thursday, July 29. Four vascular screenings will be offered that scan for potential health problems related to: blocked arteries which is a leading cause of stroke; abdominal aortic aneurysms which can lead to a ruptured aorta; hardening of the arteries in the legs which is a strong predictor of heart disease; atrial fibrillation or irregular heartbeat which is closely tied to stroke; additional bone density screening for men and women to assess the risk of osteoporosis. **Catechism of the Catholic Church 858:** Jesus is the Father’s Emissary. From the beginning of his ministry, he called to him those whom he desired; . . . And he appointed twelve whom also he named apostles, to be with him and to be sent out to preach.” From then on, they would also be his “emissaries” (Greek *apostoloi*). In them, Christ continues his own mission: “As the Father has sent me, even so I send you.” The apostles’ ministry is the continuation of his mission; Jesus said to the Twelve: “he who receives you receives me.”
