

Catholic education has been flourishing in Frankfort since 1860, first provided by the Sisters of Charity of Nazareth and the Christian brothers in two separate schools, one for girls and one for boys. In 1880, the Sisters took over both schools and in 1917 Good Shepherd Church purchased the school and renamed it Good Shepherd School. The Sisters of Charity of Nazareth continued their service in the school until 1968 and were followed by Sisters from the Congregation of Divine Providence and lay teachers. The high school was discontinued in 1917 but re-established in 1922 and provided a Catholic secondary education until 1970. Good Shepherd School has continually provided elementary education adding kindergarten and preschool classes over time. GSCS currently offers classes for students in Preschool through 8th grade.

In 1922, the cornerstone was laid for a new school building on Wapping St. close to the church and the building was dedicated and opened in 1923. In 1956, four more classrooms and a cafeteria were added to the building. A second building was added to the church property in 1962. A gymnasium was erected next to the church on Wapping St. in 1982.

In 2010 Good Shepherd celebrated 150 years of Catholic education in Frankfort with a move from Wapping St. to the church property on Shepherd Way off Leestown Rd. on the east side of Frankfort. The buildings on Wapping St. were sold and the school operated in temporary classrooms until a new school building, gymnasium, and parish offices were completed in 2012. The Shepherd Way campus is now the permanent home of Good Shepherd Catholic Parish.
