



Holy Week

Join your parish and the whole Church in celebrating the Holiest Days of the Year.

The Easter Triduum begins Holy Thursday and has no dismissal until the night of the Easter Vigil.

On Thursday we celebrate the Institution of the Holy Eucharist.

On Friday we remember in a solemn way the death of Jesus and pray for the whole humankind. We hear the Isaiah reading of the Suffering Servant and we venerate the Cross. This is the only day of the year when Holy Mass is not celebrated.

On Saturday we celebrate the longest, most beautiful of the Church's liturgies. We light the Easter fire and process into a darkened church. We read the story of our salvation and are reminded of our Baptism and celebrate Christ's victory over death.
