

THE FEAST OF ALL SOULS



The Church has encouraged prayer for the dead from its earliest days as an act of Christian Charity. Praying for the dead is one of the Spiritual Works of Mercy. This particular feast is a commemoration of all the faithful departed of Christ. It dates back to the ninth century. However, as early as the seventeenth century it had become a custom in monasteries to set aside a day to pray for the deceased. The date of November 2nd was chosen by a Benedictine Abbot in the monastery at Cluny. This feast later spread to Rome in the fourteenth century. In 1915, prompted by the large number of those who died during the First World War, Pope Benedict XV extended this feast to the Universal Church. It is a feast on which the Church comes together to offer prayer to God for all those who have died.
