Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

There's a bit of an elephant in the room as Ezra reads that foundational scripture to the men, women, and children old enough to understand. What none of them is admitting is that, after returning to the land from the Babylonian Exile, things haven't worked out as well as they had hoped.

Their new Temple is puny compared to the majestic Temple that Solomon built (and Nebuchadnezzar burned). The returnees are dwelling in a desolate, undefended city, tilling a few ravaged fields, easy prey for marauding bandits.

When Ezra reads this document (now called the Torah), their response is to hang their heads and weep. And what does Governor Nehemiah do? He interrupts to declare a holiday, and to exhort them to eat and drink and rejoice. Why? Because he knows what they have forgotten: *the joy of the Lord is their strength. Nothing less will ever be enough.*

In today's synagogue services there is a stirring moment. After the sacred readings, the homily, and the singing of the psalms, a spotlight is shone on the tabernacle. Those with the priestly last name of Cohen (or Kohen) come forward. This group, with the rabbi, takes the five dazzling Torah scrolls and begins to dance with them.

And then all heaven breaks out. The children leap up to dance with their parents. Joyous groups jump out of their pew to greet the Torah as it passes by. For a raucous few minutes the sedate assembly exults in the joy of Torah. Another week of hard work looms for all, but on the Sabbath they draw deeply from their greatest strength, which is the joy that only comes from intimacy with God.

Tercer Domingo de Tiempo Ordinario

Fue como si hubiese un gran elefante en medio del salón ese día cuando Esdras les lee esa escritura tan fundamental a todos los hombres, mujeres y niños de edad suficiente para comprender. Lo que ninguno de ellos admite es que al regresar a la tierra después de exilio en Babilonia, las cosas no les estaban resultando tan bien como se lo habían esperado.

Su nuevo Templo parece insignificante comparado con el majestuoso Templo que construyó Salomón (y que Nabucodonosor quemó). Los que regresaban estaban viviendo en una ciudad desolada, desprotegida, arando unos cuantos campos devastados, y siendo presas fáciles de bandidos saqueadores.

Cuando Esdras les lee este documento (que ahora se llama el Torá), ellos en respuesta cuelgan las cabezas y lloran. ¿Y qué es lo que hace el gobernador Nehemías? Los interrumpe para declarar un día de fiesta, y los exhorta a comer y beber y regocijarse. ¿Por qué? Porque sabe lo que han olvidado: *el gozo del Señor será su fuerza. Ninguna otra cosa nunca les bastará.*

En los servicios de las sinagogas que se llevan a cabo hoy hay un momento emotivo. Después de las lecturas sagradas, la homilía, y el cantar de los salmos, se dirige una luz hacia el tabernáculo. Aquellos que tienen el apellido sacerdotal Cohen (o Kohen) pasan al frente. Este grupo, con el rabí, toman cinco deslumbrantes rollos de Torá y comienzan a bailar con ellos.

Y luego el cielo cae a la tierra. Los niños brincan a bailar con sus padres. Los grupos gozosos salen de sus bancas a saludar al Torá mientras que pasa por donde están. Por unos cuantos momentos estrepitosos la tranquila asamblea se regocija en la alegría del Torá. Les espera otra ardua semana de trabajo a todos, pero en el Sabbat ellos sacan de la profundidad donde hallan sus mayores fuerzas, que es el gozo que solamente procede de la intimidad con Dios.

**Questions of the week~****First Reading**

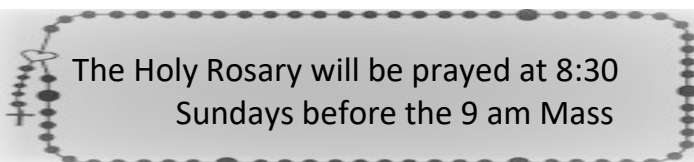

GOSPEL MEDITATION

"He came to Nazareth, where he had grown up." Did you grow up in a small town? Whenever you see stories of tight-knit communities, a common refrain is that everybody knows everybody and that's very difficult to change. If you leave and return, people expect you to be and act a certain way, and it's strange for them if you do not. In today's Gospel, we see that Jesus was already moving "in the power of the Spirit and news of him spread throughout the whole region. He...was praised by all." His ministry has begun! News of his growing popularity must have proceeded him to Nazareth.

Upon his arrival, he "went according to his custom into the synagogue on the sabbath day." For the first few moments, he is what they expect - their hometown boy returning to pay his respects. As was common of men at the time, he takes a turn reading a passage of Sacred Scripture. It is a bold passage, one he selects intentionally. "He unrolled the scroll and found the passage where it was written: The Spirit of the Lord is upon me." After reading about holy anointings, liberation for the poor and prisoners, and physical healings, Jesus does the unthinkable. "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing." We are all called to imitate Christ wherever we are. This might mean doing the unexpected! All too often we're content with the daily status quo, and so are the people around us. When we take a stand for Christian values, change our lifestyle to reflect the Gospel, and work for justice in society, we may make others uncomfortable. But Jesus doesn't call us to the same life we lived yesterday or the year before that. He is calling all of us - each and every one of us - to deeper conversion of heart. No matter what other people expect, will you love in the Spirit of the Lord today?

LIVE THE LITURGY -~

St. Theresa of Avila reminds us that, "Christ has no body now on earth but yours; no hands but yours; no feet but yours. Yours are the eyes through which the compassion of Christ must look out on the world. Yours are the feet with which He is to go about doing good. Yours are the hands with which He is to bless His people." We are, in every way shape and form, the Body of Christ. Our bodies are not just one single part but many. We are many, and we are all uniquely different. Yet each in his or her own way contributes significantly to the whole. We are all baptized in one spirit, and there are no distinctions that separate us. We must keep our eyes focused on the greater whole and not get distracted or consumed with particular parts. Everything and everyone must work together for the praise and glory of God.
